As in the past, Narcotics Control Bureau continues its focus on capacity building and training. During the period January to March 2014, Narcotics Control Bureau organized 65 Drug Law Enforcement training programmes wherein personnel of different Central/ State agencies were trained.

The construction of office-cum-residential complex has been completed in Kolkata and site beautification is under process. On the organizational front, 01 staff has been promoted from Havaldar to LDC and a total of 17 officers in different ranks were taken to Narcotics Control Bureau on deputation.

The Employee Corner continues to provide platform to the Narcotics Control Bureau Officers/ Staffs to express their mind and thoughts in shape of articles. The magazine through this chapter presents "Down Memory Lane", a highlight of articles that were published in earlier editions of Narcontrol.

1. OPERATIONS

Significant Seizures

- ❖ On 03.01.2014, Officer of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Kolkata Zonal Unit arrested one lady in followup action conducted in connection with the seizures of 107 Kg of Ganja affected on 03.08.2013 at Kolkata.
- ❖ On 08.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 9.90 Kg of Hashish from a courier parcel. The drug was concealed inside the parcels of Metal Flower Pots. The intended destination of the parcel was United Kingdom.
- ❖ On 08.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau Imphal Sub-Zone seized 32.5 grams of Heroin from the possession of one person. He was arrested.
- ❖ On 09.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau Imphal Sub-Zone seized 61 grams of Heroin from the possession of one person. The person was arrested.
- ❖ On 10.01.2014. Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 4.5 grams of Cocaine at Mumbai. Three persons were arrested.
- ❖ On 10.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Chennai Zonal Unit arrested one Malaysian National in followup action conducted in connection with the seizures of 38 grams & 44 grams of Amphetamine Type Stimulant (ATS) affected on 22.12.2013 at Chennai.
- ❖ On 11.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 10.6 Kg of Hashish at Chandigarh. The drug was concealed inside the three Briefcases. Three persons were arrested
- ❖ On 13.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 15 Kg of Opium at Jodhpur. Two persons were arrested.
- ❖ On 15.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit seized 4.308 Kg (7028 Nos.) capsules of Spasmo Proxyvon.
- ❖ On 16.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Imphal Sub-Zone seized 1.780 Kg of Opium from the possession of one person. He was arrested.
- ❖ On 16.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized a parcel of 74 bathing towels at the premises of a courier company at Andheri, Mumbai. The towels were impregnated with contraband purported to be Ketamine. Three foreign nationals were arrested in this case.
- ❖ On 17.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 0.460 Kg of Heroin from a parcel at the premises of a courier company at Sultanpur, Delhi. The drug was concealed in parcel of 16 ladies' handbags & 12 purses. The suspected destination of the seized drug was China. In follow up operation conducted on 18.01.2014 one African National named Sampson Samuel Okoro was arrested.
- ❖ On 21.01.2014, Officers of the Border Security Force, Amritsar recovered 19.90 Kg of Heroin along with one Chinese Pistol, Two magazine, 12 live rounds and one Nokia mobile phone and one Pakistan SIM card near Indo-Pakistan Border. The recovered drug



was handed over to the Narcotics Control Bureau, Amritsar Sub-Zone for action under the NDPS Act. The suspected source of the drug was South West Asia.

- ❖ On 24.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 2.890 Kg of Hashish from a parcel at Bangalore. The destination of the seized drug was USA.
- ❖ On 24.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit seized 1200 Bottles of Phensedyl Cough Syrup from four parcels at Guwahati Railway Station. The drug was concealed in shredded cloths and further packed in Bags. Two persons were arrested in this case.
- ❖ On 25.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Chennai Zonal Unit seized 123 grams of Cocaine, 10 grams of Methaqualone and 15 grams of Heroin at Chennai. One Tanzanian National was arrested.
- ❖ On 27.01.2014 & 29.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Chennai Zonal Unit seized 350 grams of Heroin from two parcels at the premises of two courier companies at Chennai. The destination of the seized drug was South Africa and Canada. One South Africa National was arrested.
- ❖ On 29.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 1.2 Kg of Morphine at Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh. One person was arrested.
- ❖ On 30.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Indore Zonal Unit seized 5 Kg of Opium at Railway Station, Neemuch. Three persons were arrested.
- ❖ On 31.01.2014, Officers of the Border Security Force recovered 1.980 Kg of Heroin with IFCN of Rs.2. Lacs, near Akhnoor along Indo-Pakistan Border. The recovered drug was handed over to the Narcotics Control Bureau, Jammu Zonal Unit for action under the NDPS Act. The source of the drug was South West Asia.
- ❖ On 31.01.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Jammu Zonal Unit seized 6.023 Kg of Hashish at Main Gate (VIP), Railway Station, Jammu Tawi. The drug was concealed in four packets and further packed in a bag. One person was arrested.
- ❖ On 02.02.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 35 Kg of Pseudoephedrine at Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi. Three foreign nationals (1 Mozambique, 1 Zimbabwe & 1 Nigeria) were arrested.
- ❖ On 03.02.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 28 grams of Mescaline from a parcel at premises of the courier company at Mumbai. The drug was concealed inside the soles of two pairs of shoes. The destination of the seized drug was Cote D'Ivoire.
- ❖ On 04.02.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 55.090 Kg of Opium along with ICN of Rs.3, 54,675/- at Jodhpur. The drug was concealed in four bags and was being trafficked by Motorcycle. One person was arrested.
- ❖ On 06.02.2014, Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Kolkata Zonal Unit seized 525 capsules of Buprenorphine at Kolkata. One person arrested.
- ❖ On 08.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit seized 51.5 Kg of Ganja at Guwahati. One person was arrested.
- ❖ On 10.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 18 Kg of





- Opium at district Jalore, Jodhpur. The drug was concealed in three packets and further concealed in LPG fuel tank of a car. Two persons were arrested.
- ❖ On 14.02.2014 Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Patna Zonal Unit seized 20.70 kgs of Ganja at Local Bus Stand, Patna. The Drug was concealed in a bag. One person was arrested.
 - ❖ On 15.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Goa Sub Zone seized 27.53 grams tablets of Ecstasy and 0.36 grams (30 Nos.) paper impregnated with LSD at Bardez, Goa. Two persons including one Nigerian National were arrested in this case.
 - ❖ On 20.02.2014, based on the intelligence provided by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), USA, officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 80 kg Ephedrine and 5 kg Methamphetamine. Complete detail of the case is awaited from Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit as the follow up operation is going on.
 - ❖ On 22.02.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Ahmedabad Zonal Unit seized 25.310 Kg of Hashish at Vadodara Railway Station. The drug was concealed in carry bags. 03 persons were arrested.
 - ❖ On 24.02.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 63 blot of LSD, 17 pills of MDMA/Ecstasy and 0.645 Kg of Cannabis Herb at Mangalore. The drug was concealed in polythene bags. Two persons were arrested.
 - ❖ On 25.02.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 2.96 Kg of Ketamine concealed in two cartons in a courier parcel at DTDC Courier & Cargo, Mumbai.
 - ❖ On 01.03.2014, officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Chennai Zonal Unit in a joint venture with Tamil Nadu Police seized 65 kgs of Pseudo-Ephedrine at Chennai. The drug was concealed in three Luggage bags. One person was arrested.
 - ❖ On 03.03.2014, officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 19.60 kg of Cannabis Herb at Lucknow Railway Station. The drug was concealed in travelling bag. One person was arrested.
 - ❖ On 06.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 18 kg of Hashish at Kalwar Road, Jhotwada, Jaipur. Two persons were arrested.
 - ❖ On 07.03.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Ahmedabad Zonal Unit seized 4 kg of Ephedrine, 680 grams of Amphetamine & 5000 tablets of Ephedrine at Mandvini pole, Ahmedabad and busted illicit clandestine laboratory. One person was arrested.
 - ❖ On 08.03.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Chandigarh Zonal Unit, participated in a joint operation conducted by Operational Cell of Union Territory, Chandigarh Police seized 147 kg Poppy Husk in Chandigarh. Two persons were arrested.
 - ❖ On 15.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 0.380 kg of Heroin at Bangalore from the office of a Courier company.
 - ❖ On 19.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Kolkata Zonal Unit seized 28, 920 tablets of Nitrazepam at NSCBI, Airport. The drug was concealed in a bag containing shoes. Further, in followup operation 16.800 kg capsules of Spasmo Proxymovan containing Dextropropoxyphene has also seized. The drug was concealed in polythene packets. Two persons were arrested.



Narcotics Control Bureau

- ❖ On 22.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Hyderabad Sub-Zone and Narcotics Control Bureau, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 21.360 kg of 1-phenyl-2-propanone (P2P) at the Old Safilguda, Hyderabad and busted an illicit clandestine laboratory. Four persons were arrested in this case.
- ❖ On 27.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 300 grams of Ganja at Kutub Road Pahargang, New Delhi. One Nigerian National was arrested.
- ❖ On 27.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 7.2 kg of Hashish at Chandigarh. The drug was concealed in bags which were placed under the front seat of a car. Five persons were arrested.
- ❖ On 29.03.2014, officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Hyderabad Sub Zone conducted a followup operation and arrested 01 person in response to the seizure of 21.360 kg of 1-Phenyl-2-Propanone (P2P) on 22.03.2014.





CONTROL DELIVERY OPERATION

❖ In continuation to the seizure of 1.900 kg Methaqualone at Mumbai by Narcotics Control Bureau Mumbai Zonal Unit on 20.12.2013 and the subsequent sharing of information with the Australian authorities by the Narcotics Control Bureau, an International Controlled Delivery Operation was undertaken by the Australian authorities which led to busting of an Illicit Clandestine Methamphetamine Laboratory and seizure of some fire arms in Australia. Four drug traffickers were arrested in the case. Complete detail of the case is awaited from Australian Federal Police. The controlled operation was conducted after removing the drug and sending a dummy parcel.

DESTRUCTION OF ILLICIT CULTIVATION

- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit cannabis cultivation in Sipaijilla District of Tripura, the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit has destroyed illicit cannabis cultivation over 70 acres of land in two cases on 15.01.2014 and 16.01.2014.
- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit cannabis cultivation in Miapara, Devipur and Kamalasagar area in the Sepahijala district of Tripura, the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit destroyed illicit cannabis cultivation over 53 acres of land on 17.01.2014.
- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit Opium Poppy cultivation in the area of Baruni Hills, East Imphal district of Manipur, the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 15 acres of land on 29.01.2014.
- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit Opium Poppy cultivation in the area of Churachandpur district of Manipur, the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 35 acres of land on 04.02.2014 to 06.02.2014.
- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit Opium Poppy cultivation in the area of Senapati District of Manipur, the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit & Assam Rifles destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 105 acres of land on 12.02.2014 to 13.02.2014.
- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit Opium Poppy cultivation in the area of Malda, West Bengal the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Kolkata Zonal Unit in association with State Police & State Excise destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 172 acres of land on 14.02.2014 to 18.02.2014. During the operation, two cases were booked against the illicit cultivators.
- ❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit Opium Poppy cultivation in the area of Upper Siang district of Arunachal Pradesh, the Officers of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit along with State Police destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 12 acres of land on 19.02.2014.
- ❖ On 24.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit along with

State Police and Assam Rifles conducted destruction operation in Tirap district of Arunachal Pradesh and destroyed 48 acres of illicit opium poppy. ❖ On 25.02.2014 and 26.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit along with State Police and CRPF conducted destruction operation in Longding district of Arunachal Pradesh and destroyed 108 acres of illicit opium poppy.

❖ From 25.02.2014 to 27.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit along with Arunachal Pradesh Police conducted destruction operation in Anjaw district of Arunachal Pradesh and destroyed 63 acres of illicit opium poppy.

❖ On 26.02.2014, Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Bhubaneswar Sub-Zone destroyed 0.09 acres of illicit poppy cultivation in Angul district, Odisha. During the operation, one case was booked against the illicit cultivator.

❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit opium poppy cultivation in Changlang district of Arunachal Pradesh, the Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal

Unit along with State Police, Indian Reserve Battalion and CRPF have destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 26 acres of land from 01.03.2014 to 02.03.2014.

❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit opium poppy cultivation Lohit district of Arunachal Pradesh, the Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit along with State Police, Central Bureau of Narcotics and Indian Reserve Battalion have destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 272 acres of land on 06.03.2014.

❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit opium poppy cultivation in Loilang, Loihitpur, Tafrogram in Tezu Circle of Lohit district of Arunachal Pradesh, the Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Guwahati Zonal Unit along with Indian Reserve Battalion have destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 207 acres of land on 13.03.2014.

❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit opium poppy cultivation in district Malda of West Bengal, the Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Kolkata Zonal Unit have destroyed illicit opium poppy cultivation over 303 acres of land from 06.03.2014 to 13.03.2014. 03 cases have been booked.

❖ In an operation launched to destroy illicit cannabis cultivation in district 24 Parganas (N) of West Bengal, the Officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Kolkata Zonal Unit have destroyed illicit cannabis cultivation over three acres of land on 13.03.2014. During the operation, one case was booked against the illicit cultivator.

DRUG DEMAND REDUCTION

One of the core duties of Narcotics Control Bureau is to create public awareness regarding the ill-effects of drug abuse which is corroding the modern society and to promote the concept of living healthy life free of drugs. This is done through various platforms including awareness campaigns, rallies, print and visual media etc.

Awareness Programmes

Narcotics Control Bureau organizes awareness programmes so as to curtail the menace of drug abuse engulfing all sections of the society especially young students. Drug abuse along with the abuse of alcohol coupled with smoking of tobacco products is taking a heavy toll on the health of the youth. It entails not only health costs but also economic and social costs. To summarize, the spread of drug abuse among the youth has started damaging the foundation of our society. Narcotics Control Bureau is spreading awareness against drug abuse directly by addressing the students, their parents, teachers and counsellors.

- Narcotics Control Bureau had sent a Compact Disc (C.D.) which contained presentation about drug abuse and drug dependence to all the District Magistrate in India. The initiative was taken to sensitize the youth and youngsters against the evils of drug dependence and addiction. The initiative was well appreciated and a positive reply came in this context. One such appreciation was received from the Collector & District Magistrate of Udaipur, Rajasthan on 24th March, 2014.

MODUS OPERANDI

Hiding drugs in body cavities

by P. Bargain *

THE imagination of drug smugglers knows no bounds: drugs have been found in false-bottomed suitcases, cottage-industry products, tins bearing canned-goods labels and various disguises, to give but a few examples. However, the measures taken to detect such methods of concealment are now so

effective that couriers are literally forced to risk their lives when smuggling drugs, by hiding them in their body cavities.

In addition to their normal work, doctors at the Medical Emergency and Treatment Centre at Roissy Charles de Gaulle Airport are often asked by the Customs to examine

people suspected of concealing drugs *in corpore*.

The small number of possibilities involved and the common features found in most of the cases encountered have made it possible for us to offer the following analysis and classification of cases.

METHODS OF CONCEALING DRUGS

Under this heading we shall consider only methods which may necessitate intervention by a doctor.

Concealment of drugs in corpore

Our experience since the end of 1979 has enabled us to divide people who conceal drugs within their bodies into two categories: "swallowers" and "stuffers".

"Swallowers"

To avoid customs checks, the courier swallows the drug in the

form of small pellets weighing 1 to 5 grams, wrapped in several layers of latex (finger tips of surgical gloves) and tied up. Once the pellets have been swallowed, they make their way along the digestive system (the stomach, the small intestine and colon, and the rectal cavity). The total weight swallowed can be as much as 600 grams.

In the producer country, the courier fasts for 48 hours and then, over a period varying from 12 to 16 hours, swallows from one hundred to two hundred pellets between mouthfuls of soup or jam. Once a pellet has got past the pharyngo-oesophageal sphincter, the swallower can no longer control its course until it reaches the anal

expulsion stage. The motor impulses which carry the swallowed item between the oesophagus and the anus are automatic. To slow the process down, the courier takes intestinal poultices, antispasmodics, or antidiarrhoea medication.

He then boards his plane and throughout the flight usually refuses any kind of solid food, consuming only cold drinks. Once he arrives at his destination, where the drugs are to be delivered, he eliminates the pellets in the normal way. The pellets swallowed last are in different coloured wrappings from the rest, so that he can tell when elimination is complete. It is possible to retain the pellets *in situ* for 48 hours after swallowing the last of them.

This method is used by couriers (both men and women) bringing cocaine from South America. However, since mid-December 1985, Nepalese couriers have been found using this method to smuggle heroin: the first were intercepted at Roissy - Charles de Gaulle Airport on arrival from Kathmandu. The latex tubes containing the drugs are much simpler than those used for cocaine.

In January 1986, two Swiss nationals were stopped and found to have swallowed about twenty pellets of cannabls, each weighing 5 grams. The pellets had been wrapped in cellophane which had then been thickly coated with beeswax.

In March 1986, a German passenger on an Air France flight from Bombay was found, on arrival, to be in a state of coma. He was rushed to hospital for an operation, and 292 pellets of heroin, protected

only by a wax coating, were found in his body.

"Stuffers"

The courier introduces suppositories containing drugs into the rectal cavity and/or vagina. The drug to be smuggled is compressed and given the form of a long cylinder which is then cut up into pieces 10 cm. long, 1 cm. in diameter and weighing 50 grams. These smaller cylinders are first wrapped in cellophane, then covered by several layers of adhesive plastic tape, and finally put into one or two condoms to facilitate insertion.

With both men and women, the rectal cavity is the one most commonly used. Since the vagina has no sphincter, any drugs inserted have to be kept in place with a sanitary towel. Insertion is made

easier by the use of some form of grease (vaseline, haemorrhoid cream, cocoa-butter, etc.)

In this way, a courier can carry up to 550 grams of a drug. A woman — who was 7 months pregnant — was intercepted at Roissy - Charles de Gaulle Airport in January 1985 and was found to be carrying 100 grams of heroin in her vagina ! This method has been used for a variety of drugs.

Concealment of drugs para corpore

Again, there seems to be no limit to what smugglers can imagine. Possible hiding places which a doctor may be required to investigate include plaster casts, bulky dressings, orthopaedic devices, etc.

OBSERVATIONS BY CUSTOMS OFFICERS OR DOCTORS WHICH GIVE GROUNDS FOR SUSPICION OR ESTABLISH GUILT

Observations by Customs Officers

We are not able to divulge the criteria governing a customs officer's decision to make a passenger undergo a medical examination.

Observations by doctors

The medical factors giving grounds for suspicion or establishing

the presence of drugs *in corpore* are described below.

A. "Swallowers"

- Baggage found to contain medication to slow down the passage of substances through the intestine, but no intestinal disinfectant: obviously, a person with diarrhoea contracted while travelling is less suspect.
- Breath smelling of acetone, which confirms that the suspect has been fasting: passengers tend to compensate for the bore-

dom of long-haul flights by eating and drinking a great deal, with the full encouragement of the airline companies. It is therefore not normal for a passenger to refuse all the meals and snacks offered to him, unless of course the digestive tract is full ! Refusal of hot drinks or solid food can also be motivated by the fear that a pellet might burst under the effect of digestive juices.

- The medical examination; the doctor must :
(1) Check that the suspect has



signed the consent form presented by the Customs Officer.

(2) Carry out the examination with the suspect naked, lying on his or her back, with an empty bladder.

(a) The examination begins with thorough palpation of the abdomen to detect the presence of any small lumps, which move under pressure, in the projection area of the right, transverse and left colon. (If the doctor finds small lumps, the suspect will immediately claim to have swollen ganglions!)

(b) It ends with pelvic touch examination (rectal and/or vaginal). Where pellets have been swallowed, they will have passed easily through the digestive tract, despite any products taken to slow down the process, and are bound to be in the rectal cavity.

When a suspect is thin, the pellets are more easily detected by palpation; with an obese suspect, the presence of swallowed pellets can only be confirmed by pelvic touch examination.

B. "Stuffers"

- Tube of some form of cream or grease in baggage.
- A large number of condoms.
- Surgical thread for stitching, or dental floss.
- Discrepancy between a woman's supply of contraceptive pills and her claim to be menstruating in order to avoid a body search by a female Customs officer.
- Claims to have some form of venereal disease or haemorrhoids.
- Grease marks on the crotch of underpants.
- The medical examination — The doctor must:

(1) Check that the suspect has signed the consent form presented

by the Customs officer.

(2) Carry out the examination with the suspect naked, and with an empty bladder.

(a) Have the suspect get up and sit down on a hard seat several times ; a person not concealing drugs will sit down normally on both buttocks, whereas a "stuffer" will place one buttock on the seat, gingerly sliding the other buttock after it.

(b) Spread open the groove between the buttocks to see if there is any sign of a thread attached to a suppository.

(c) With the suspect lying on his or her back, thoroughly palpate the abdomen, feeling for the presence of any lump in the projection area of the left colon and of the sigmoid flexure. Lumps are rarely found unless the suspect is very thin.

(d) Pelvic palpation is the vital part of the examination.

Rectal palpation immediately gives the answer, easily disclosing the presence of a lump or lumps. The examination is carried out with the suspect lying on the back or on the left side, but never with the knees pulled up to the chest, as that position would make the suppository drop down under its own weight into the sigmoid flexure, thus escaping detection.

With women, vaginal palpation immediately indicates whether or not there are suppositories in the rectal cavity — they can be felt through the recto-vaginal wall. Rectal palpation should then follow.

The rectal cavity always contains some faecal matter; if the rectal cavity is absolutely empty (in which case, the finger-stall will emerge clean and greased), this can mean that the suspect had time to eliminate the suppositories surreptitiously before or during the customs baggage check. It will

therefore be necessary to look for them either in the baggage checking area itself or between that area and the medical centre.

C. Subsequent action

Once the diagnosis has been made, the drugs must be eliminated either digitally or spontaneously. It is important for the doctor to obtain a specimen pellet or suppository in order to :

- check the state of the wrapping and have the suspect taken to hospital immediately if it looks as though the wrappings may burst spontaneously,
- provide physical evidence,
- reassure the Customs officer that his intuition was right.

The doctor then draws up a report describing the examination conducted and giving the findings.

D. Other examination techniques

For Customs checks at Roissy - Charles de Gaulle Airport, the palpation technique has the advantage of being rapid and requiring only simple equipment which every doctor has available.

Use of X-rays is not appropriate, either socially (the passenger is held up) or as far as diagnosis is concerned — lumps of the same density as the soft tissues do not always show up on an abdomen X-ray without prior preparation.

Ultrasonic scans did not come up to our expectations: the expansion of gas in the hollow viscera caused by the plane journey prevents the passage of the waves. Consequently, we no longer use this method.

These figures correspond to the seizures made at our Medical Emergency and Treatment Centre at Roissy - Charles de Gaulle Airport. However, the actual total weight of

drugs seized is greater, since the couriers may be handed over to the police with some pellets or suppositories still remaining in corpore.

CONCLUSIONS

Medical examinations conducted by doctors at the Medical Emergency and Treatment Centre at Roissy - Charles de Gaulle Airport are carried out at the request of Customs officers, who are responsible for preliminary screening of passengers, and with the consent of the people concerned. These medical examinations are an effective method of detecting drugs being transported in corpore and have made it possible to define two types of courier: "swallowers" and "stuffers".

The examination techniques — palpation and pelvic touch — are purely clinical. For reasons of speed and reliability, this type of examination is preferable to other types such as X-rays or scanning.

The results obtained from these medical examinations are highly significant, bearing in mind the fact that hiding-places under consideration are few in number and restricted in scale.
