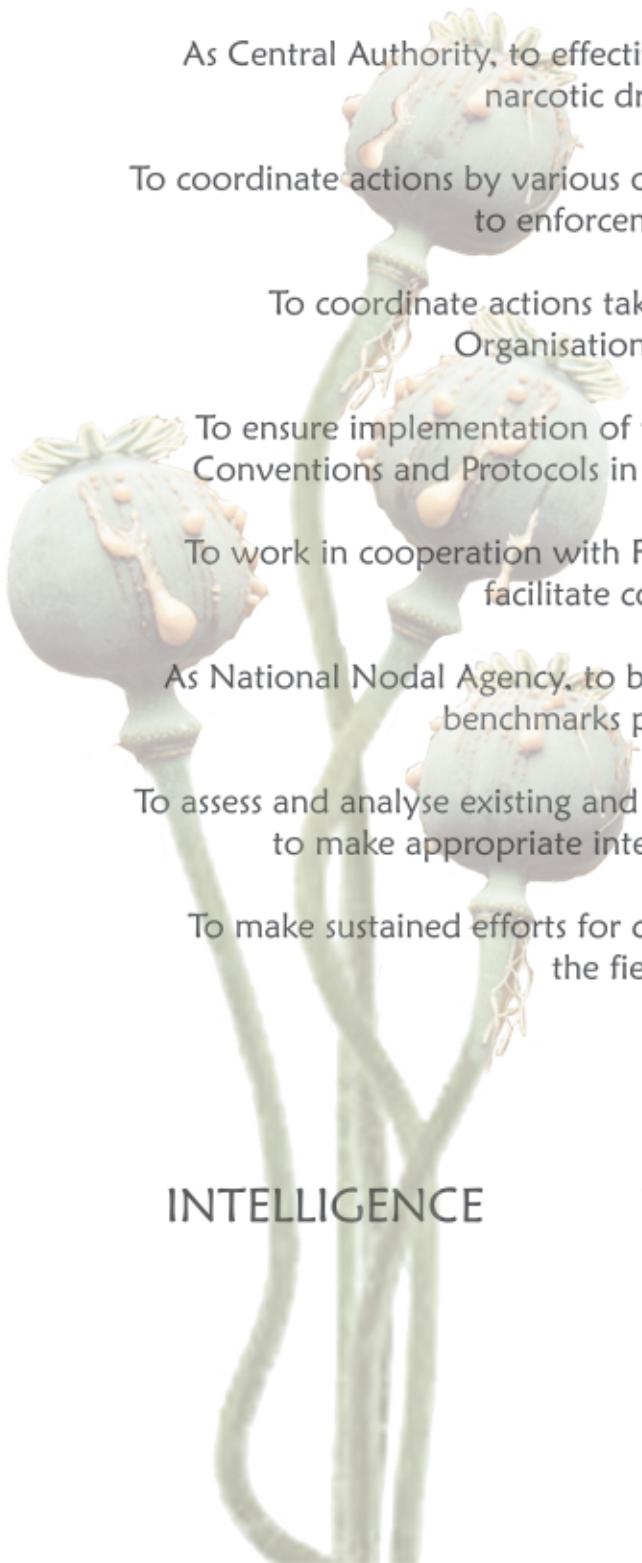

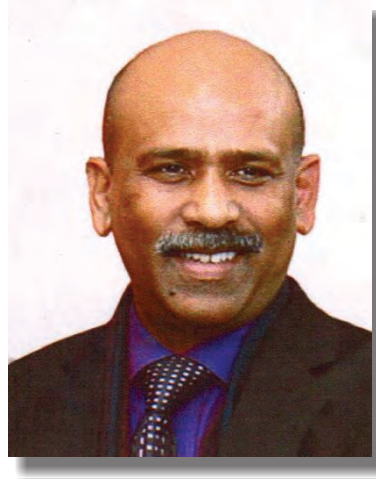

From the Desk of DIRECTOR GENERAL

I am pleased to present the Annual Report, 2019 for the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB). The Annual Report summarizes the trends and patterns of drug trafficking, depicts statistics of drug law enforcement activities undertaken by NCB being the nodal agency of the Government of India. It also highlights the coordination efforts at national as well as international level to combat the problem of drug trafficking and the scourge of drug abuse. Besides, the report also delineates the measures taken for capacity-building and training of personnel of various drug law enforcement agencies, stakeholders and also the drug demand reduction activities undertaken by NCB.

The Demand Reduction Strategy primarily focuses on the efforts/steps taken by NCB to reduce the public desire for consumption of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances. NCB has made sincere and committed efforts to spread the awareness among masses about the ill effects of drug abuse by organising various programmes at schools and colleges throughout the country.

The changing paradigm of the global drug trafficking places India at a spot which characterizes it both as a source as well as a transit country. At present NCB has a pan-India presence through 3 Regional Offices, 13 Zones and 12 Sub-Zones. Regional Offices and field units are actively co-ordinating and mobilizing with State/Central agencies to strengthen their efforts in drug interdiction. NCB Headquarters co-ordinates with foreign countries and organizations like INCB and UNODC. During the year 2019, NCB had participated in 28 international meetings to fulfill the country's international obligation with regard to illicit trafficking in drugs.

I would like to appreciate the team NCB for their efforts in bringing out this Annual Report.

I hope you find this Annual Report both informative and useful. Your feedback and suggestions on how to improve the Annual Report and make it even more comprehensive and useful are always welcome.

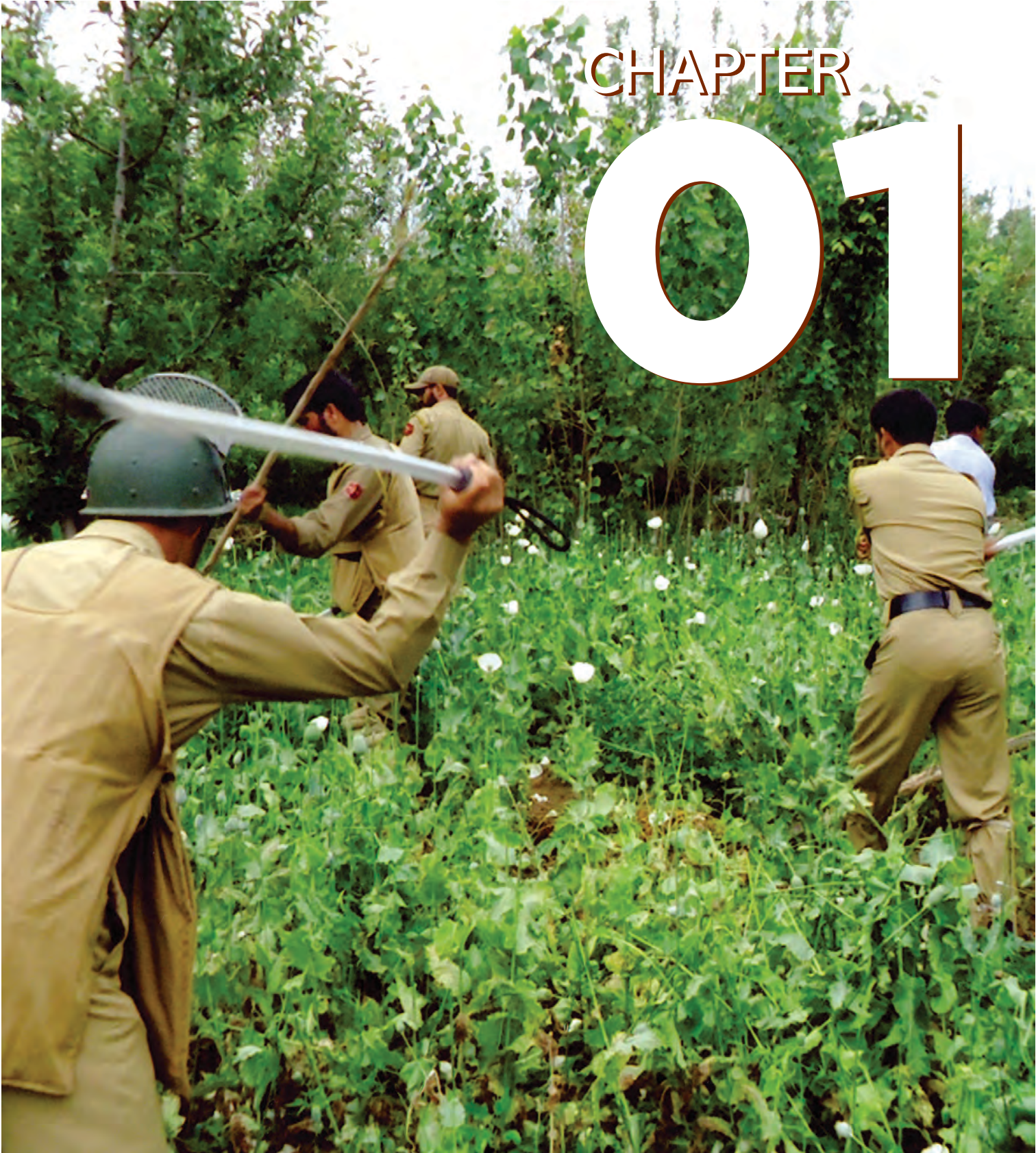

1. DRUG TRAFFICKING SCENARIO IN INDIA

The drug trafficking situation in any country is determined more by its geographical factors. India is no exception. One of the prime geographical factors influencing India's drug situation is its close proximity to the Opium producing countries like Afghanistan, Pakistan & Iran in the West as well as Myanmar, Laos and Thailand in the East. The geographical location of India as such makes it vulnerable to transit, trafficking and consumption of Opium derivatives in various forms.

The main internal factor influencing drug trafficking in India is illicit cultivation of Opium Poppy and Cannabis in some pockets of the country. The diversion from licit Opium sources into illicit production is a matter of major concern. Illicit cultivation of Opium Poppy in Manipur, Bihar, Jharkhand etc. is a major concern. Similarly, illicit cultivation and wild growth of Cannabis in hilly and remote areas of Himachal Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Tripura, Odisha (Andhra-Odisha border), Jharkhand, etc., lead to intrastate and interstate Cannabis trafficking. India also hosts a large base of pharmaceutical industry and proximity to countries like China and Myanmar makes it susceptible to trafficking in pharma and other synthetic drugs especially through maritime route of Bay of Bengal.

1.1 TRENDS AND PATTERNS 2019

Drug trafficking scenario in India may be summarized as under:

- Diversion of Opium from licit cultivation and indigenous production of low quality Heroin.
- Trafficking of Heroin from South West

Asia to India and again from India to other countries.

- Trafficking of Hashish from Nepal to India.
- Illicit cultivation of Opium and wild growth of Cannabis in some States.
- Diversion of precursor chemicals and other controlled substances.
- Diversion of Ephedrine/Pseudoephedrine across Indo-Myanmar Border and reverse trafficking of Methamphetamine.
- Attempts to establish Illicit Meth labs in active collaboration with foreign collaborators.
- Diversion of pharmaceutical preparations and prescription drugs containing psychotropic substances and trafficking to neighboring countries.
- Maritime Trafficking – use of sea route for Trafficking of Heroin and other synthetic drugs
- Internet pharmacies and misuse of courier services.
- Use of dark net and cryptocurrencies in drug trafficking.
- Involvement of foreign nationals in trafficking and distribution networks.

1.2 NARCOTIC DRUGS

1.2.1 OPIUM

Papaver Somniferum, commonly known as the opium poppy, is a species of flowering plant in the family Papaveraceae. It is the species of plant from which opium and poppy seeds are derived. Opium is the coagulated juice of the Opium Poppy. It is a plant that grows in many countries around the world with moderate climate. Raw

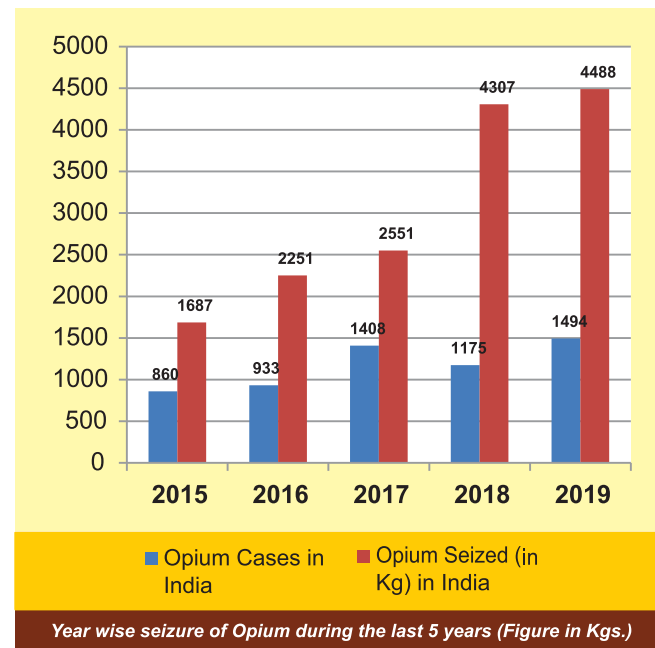
Opium is a non-homogeneous material containing Poppy capsule fragments. It is sticky, tar-like and dark brown when fresh, and becomes brittle and hard as it ages. Raw Opium is produced by the air drying of Opium. Opium contains a class of naturally occurring alkaloids known as opiates that include morphine, Thebaine, Codeine, papaverine, Noscapine and oripavine. Heroin is synthesized from Opium.

Trends:

- Trafficking from Rajasthan, Jharkhand, U.P. and M.P. to other parts of country.
- Major trafficking of Opium is from the states of Manipur, West Bengal, Jammu & Kashmir, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Jharkhand and Gujarat.



Total Opium seizures affected in 2019 was 4,488 Kg. The comparative figures for the last 05 years are given below. While there has been an increasing trend in the number of reported Opium seizures in comparison to previous years, up to 2018, the quantity of Opium seized has increased from 4307 Kg in 2018 to 4,488 Kg in 2019.



Significant seizures of Opium & Poppy Straw:

- On 20.01.2019, officers of NCB, Imphal Sub Zone in coordination with BSF, Churachadpur, Manipur seized 10.300 kg of Opium along with Rs 1,00,000/- at village Patlen. 02 persons were arrested.

- On 23.02.2019, officers of NCB Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 6.600 kg Opium at Gogunda Toll Plaza, Udaipur.
- On 02.03.2019, officers of NCB, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 2.650 kg of Opium and 495.200 kg of Poppy Straw at Essar Petrol Pump, near Lehra Toll Plaza, Ludhiana - Malerkotla Road, Punjab from 02 vehicles. 03 persons were arrested.
- On 07.03.2019, NCB, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 45.395 kg of Opium at Sikandra Toll Plaza, Dausa. 01 person was arrested.
- On 10.03.2019 officers of NCB, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 6.400 kg of Opium at Village Anwalhera, Tehsil- Begu, Distt- Chittorgarh (Raj.) 01 person was arrested.
- On 18.03.2019, Officers of NCB, Jhodhpur Zonal Unit seized 50.428 kg of Opium from a vehicle at Piplaj Toll Plaza, Beawar, Distt- Ajmer. 01 person was arrested.
- On 28.03.2019, Officer of NCB, Jhodhpur Zonal Unit in co-ordination with State Police seized 7.600 kg of Opium from a vehicle. 02 persons were arrested.
- On 13.04.2019, Officers of NCB Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 8.230 kg of Opium at Rashido ki Dhani village Fitkasani. 05 persons were arrested.
- On 24.04.2019, Officers of NCB Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 4.650 kg of Opium at Shambhu Toll Barrier, Ambala, Haryana. 03 persons were arrested.
- On 14.05.2019, officers of NCB, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 19.800 kg of Opium at Shimla Highway opposite Krishi Bhawan, Panchkula (Haryana). 02 persons were arrested. On 15.05.2019, officer of NCB, Chandigarh Zonal Unit arrested 01 person in follow up operation of the same case. Further, in another follow up operation NCB seized 450 gram of Opium along with 01 weighing scale at Derabasi. 01 person was arrested.
- On 24.05.2019, Officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 2.800 kg of Opium at IGI Airport, New Delhi.
- On 21.06.2019, Officers of NCB, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 28.920 kg of Opium and 215.120 kg of Poppy straw at Pichiyak village, Bilara, Jodhpur. 02 persons were arrested.
- On 04.07.2019, officers of NCB, Kolkata Zonal Unit seized 9.780 kg of Opium and 02 mobile phones from the Banskopa Toll Plaza, Paschim Bardhaman, West Bengal. 04 persons were arrested.
- On 10.07.2019, officers of NCB, Jodhpur Zonal Unit seized 28.210 kg of Opium and Rs. 84,230/- Indian Currency at Bhinmal Road, District- Jalore (Raj.) 07 persons were arrested alongwith 03 vehicles.
- On 02.08.2019, officers of NCB, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 2.700 kg of Opium at Ludhiana Jallandhar Bypass Chowk Ludhiana Punjab. 02 persons were arrested.

CASE STUDY-BIGGEST OPIUM SEIZURE

Seizure of 50.428 Kgs of Opium in Crime No. 05/2019 OF NCB JODHPUR ZONE

On 18.03.2019, NCB Jodhpur Zonal Unit effected a seizure of 50.428 Kgs of Opium from Tata Trailer bearing Reg. No. RJ 19 GD 8365 at Piplaz Toll, Beawar, Distt. Ajmer, Rajasthan and arrested 01 person namely Omaram S/o Rakharam Chaba, R/o Vill. Bisalpur, P.S. Dangiyawas, Tehsil- Mandore, Distt. Jodhpur.

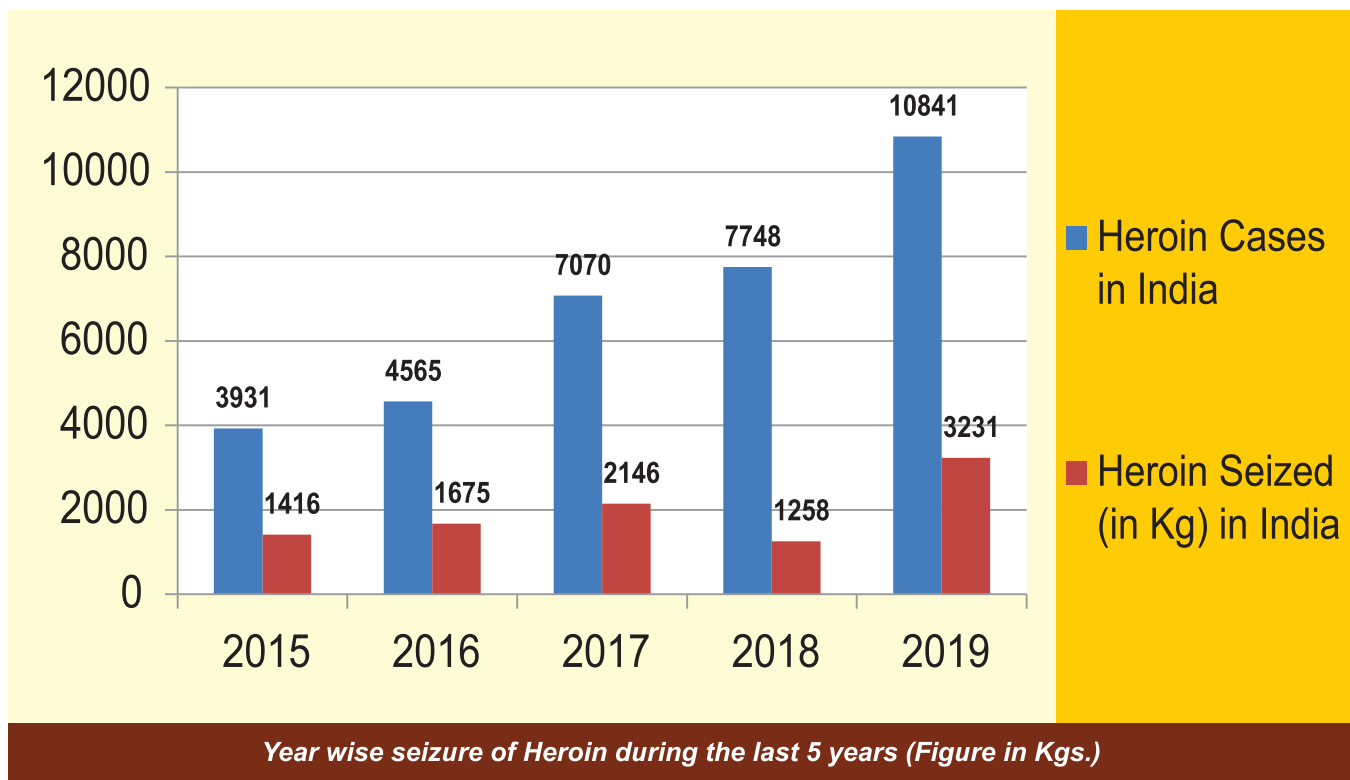
1.2.2 HEROIN

Heroin is a semi-synthetic drug which is derived from opium. It is also known as di-acetyl morphine. It comes out in a variety of colours, ranging from white & ivory to dark grey. The South West Asian origin heroin that enters India through the Indo-Pak border has a higher level of purity in comparison to the locally produced variety. The purity decreases as it passes through a number of hands to the streets due to successive levels of adulteration.



Trends:-

- South West Asian Heroin accounted for around 21% of seizures by quantity in 2018 (261.5 Kg /1258 Kg) while in 2019 it saw a huge rise to 39% (1256 Kg/ 3231 Kg), of total Heroin seized in India
- Major trafficking of Heroin in India takes place through India-Pakistan border through bordering states/UTs of Punjab and Jammu & Kashmir. From these bordering states/UTs Heroin is trafficked into other states.
- Recent trend of increase in Maritime trafficking of South West Asian Heroin through sea.
- Inter-State trafficking of Opium poppy from the states of West Bengal, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, and Manipur
- Substantial quantity seizures of Heroin have been effected in Punjab, Delhi, and UP.





Significant seizures of Heroin:

- On 03.01.2019, officers of NCB, Amritsar Sub Zone in coordination with BSF, Ferozpur, Punjab seized 1.964 kg of Heroin. The suspected source of the seized drug was South West Asia.
- On 03.01.2019, officers of NCB, Amritsar Sub Zone in coordination with BSF, Ramtirath, Amritsar, Punjab seized 1.000 kg of Heroin and 20 gram of Opium. The suspected source of the seized drug was South West Asia.

- On 06.02.2019, officers of NCB, Imphal Sub Zone in coordination with Assam Rifles seized 986 gram of Heroin and arrested 01 person.

- On 24.03.2019, Officers of NCB, Amritsar Sub Zone in co-ordination with BSF Bharopal, Khasa, Amritsar, Punjab seized 505 gram of Heroin. The suspected source of the seized drug was South West Asia.
- On 26.03.2019, Officers of NCB, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 3.300 kg of Heroin at BBD College, Lucknow. 03 persons were arrested.
- On 02.04.2019, Officers of NCB, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 650 gram of Heroin at Kanpur Central Railway Station, Kanpur. 01 person was arrested.
- On 04.04.2019, Officers of NCB, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 410 gram of Heroin and 480 gram of Alprazolam. 03 persons were arrested.
- On 06.04.2019, Officers of NCB, Amritsar Sub Zone in coordination with BSF, Ferozpur, Punjab seized 2.860 kg of Heroin. The suspected source of the seized drug was South West Asia.
- On 17.04.2019, Officers of NCB Guwahati Zonal Unit in coordination with Assam Rifles, Kheingang Post, Churachandpur, Manipur seized 1.470 kg of Heroin and 4.700 kg tablets of WY. 01 person was arrested.
- On 24.04.2019, Officers NCB Amritsar Sub Zone in coordination with BSF, Ferozpur, Punjab seized 960 gram of Heroin. The suspected source of the seized drug was South West Asia.
- On 24.04.2019, Officers of NCB Amritsar Sub Zone in coordination with BSF, Ferozpur, Punjab seized 1.500 kg of Heroin. The suspected source of the seized drug was South West Asia.
- On 25.05.2019, Officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 2.600 kg of Cocaine, 5.000 kg of Heroin and 55 gram of Amphetamine at Dwarka, New Delhi. 02 Nigerian and 01 Uganda nationals were arrested.

CASE STUDY-BIGGEST HEROIN SEIZURES

1. Seizure of 07 Kg of Heroin by NCB Delhi Zone on 24.07.2019

On receipt of a secret information a team of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit raided at Room no. 14, H.no. 170, Hauzrani, New Delhi and found two persons i.e., one Aqyar Khan Shinwari an Afghan national & Sukhdev Singh of Punjab.

During the search Aqyar Khan Shinwari

himself took out two black bags from under the bed and revealed that the bags contained Heroin which was supposed to be carried to Punjab by Sukhdev Singh. In total 07 Kg heroin was recovered during the house search and both Aqyar Khan Shinwari (Afghan national) and Sukhdev Singh (Indian National) were arrested.

2. Seizure of 08.054 Kg of Heroin by NCB Imphal Sub-Zone (Guwahati Zone) on 24.07.2019

As per the information developed by NCB Imphal, a team of NCB Imphal reached PVCP, Khudengthabi where one suspected Eco Van was stopped and on lawful search, 8.054 Kg of Heroin kept in one jumbo box concealed under the rear seat of the said vehicle was recovered and arrested 01 person.

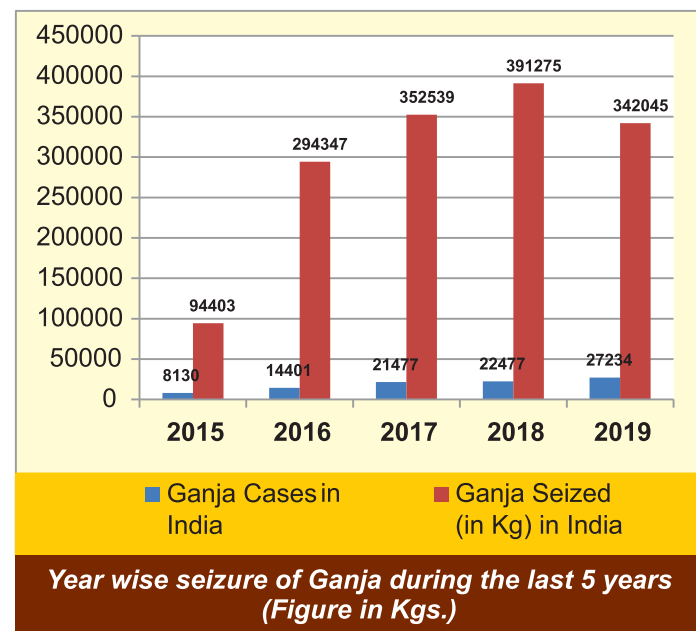
1.2.3 CANNABIS (GANJA)

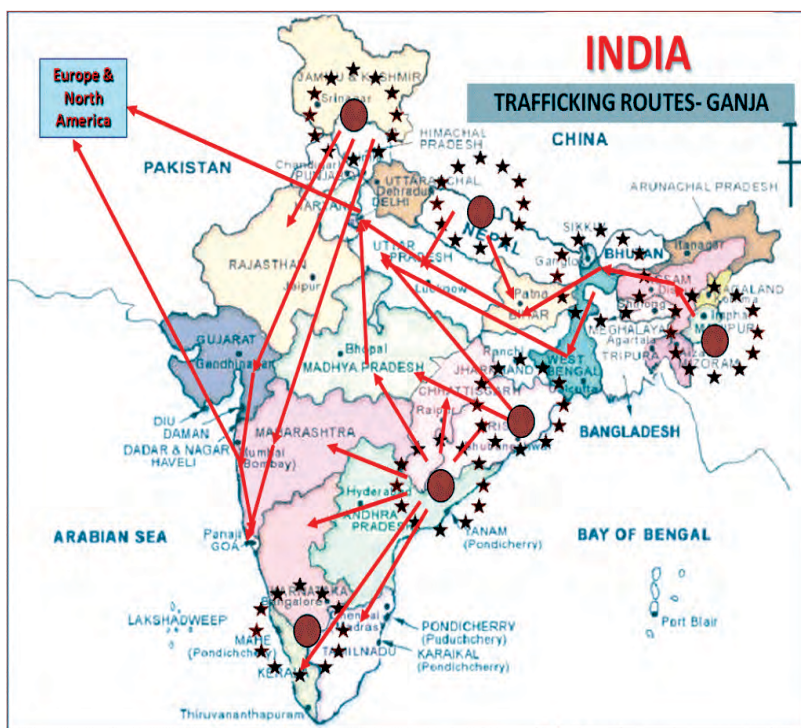
Cannabis is a genus of flowering plants in the family Cannabaceae. Cannabis, produced from the Cannabis sativa plant,

is used in three forms: herbal Cannabis, the dried leaves and flowering tops. Cannabis is also known as 'Ganja,' or 'Weed'. Cannabis resin, the pressed secretions of the plant, known as 'Hashish' or 'Charas;' and Cannabis oil, a mixture resulting from distillation or extraction of active ingredients of the plant.

Trends:

- Trafficking in substantial quantities takes place across India - Nepal border and in the states of Odisha, Himachal Pradesh and in small quantities from states of Manipur and West Bengal.
- Trafficking from the North-East India to eastern states is mainly by surface transport.
- The main transit routes for Ganja are through Assam, Odisha, West Bengal, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Nagaland and Chhattisgarh.

Case study:-

Pursuant to specific information, NCB Lucknow in a joint operation with UP STF has made a seizure of 1320.4 KGs of Ganja concealed in a truck on 20/03/2019 from Akhari over Bridge bypass, Varanasi from the possession of 05 persons all residents of Bihar and Jharkhand. Voluntary statement of the intercepted persons was recorded, wherein they confessed their involvement in trafficking of recovered Ganja. On the basis of recovery made and confessional statement they were arrested and the Truck bearing Regd. No.CG-07-AA-3202 had been seized.

As the accused were founded to be habitual drug trafficker, proposal for their detention under PITNDPS Act was sent to PITNDPS cell, New Delhi & detention order was issued in the name of 02 accused out of the 07 accused.

This is one of the biggest seizure of Charas in the year by NCB, with arrest of both carriers and receiver of the drugs along with vehicles and the nexus between the drug traffickers was exposed



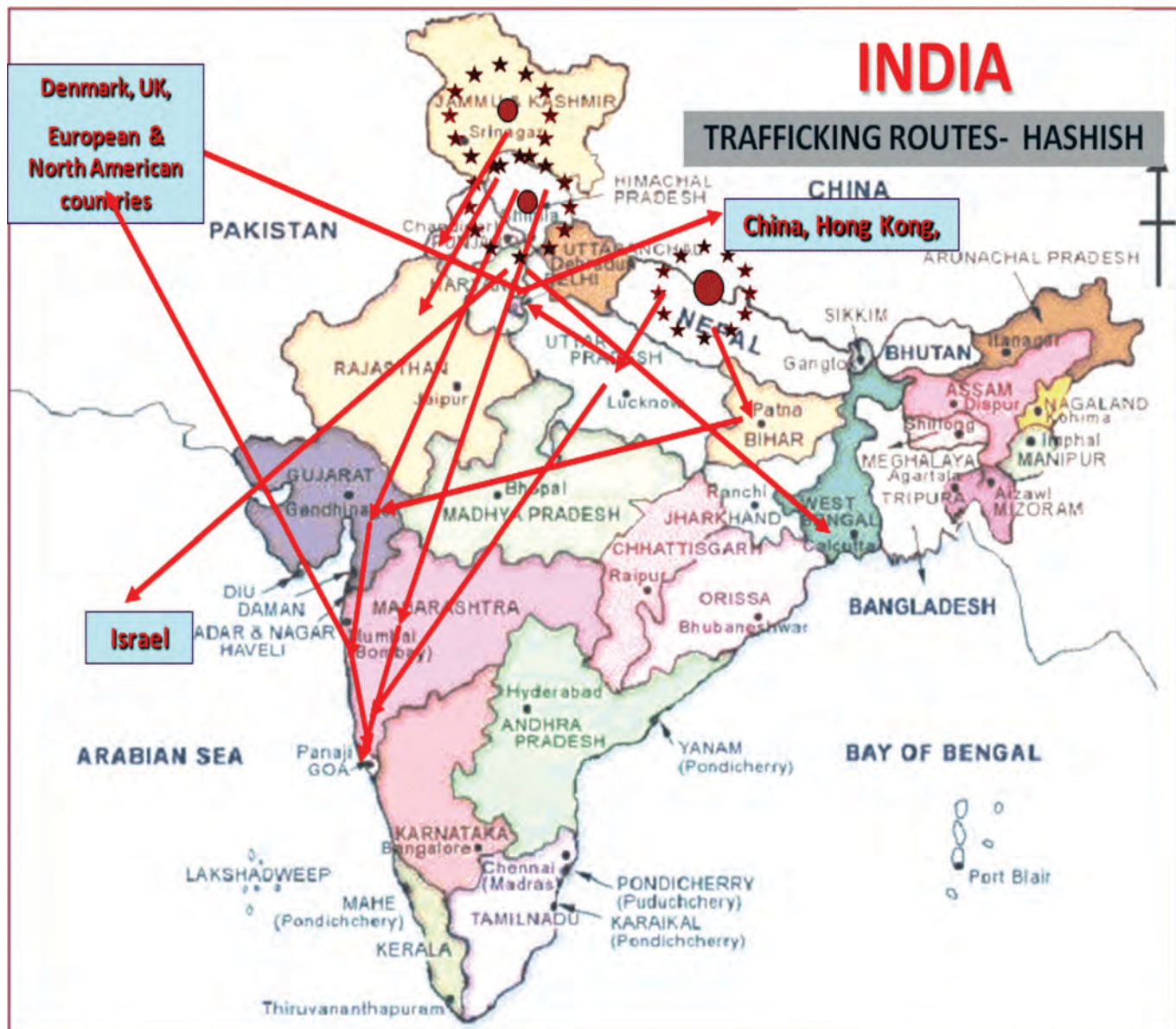
1.2.4 CANNABIS (HASHISH)

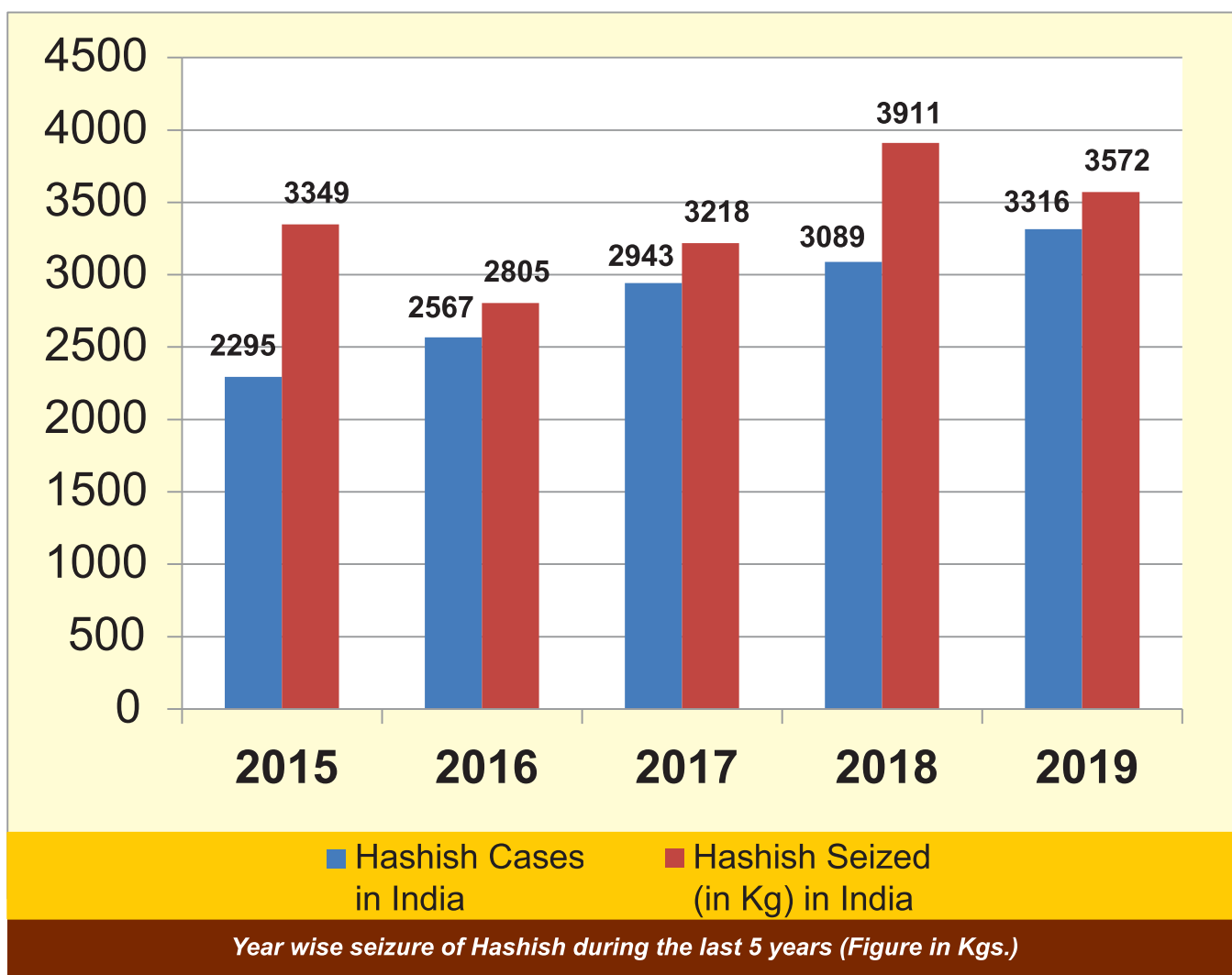
Hashish, or Charas, is a drug extracted from cannabis. Hashish is cannabis resin. Generally Hashish is extracted from the plants by rubbing the flowering tops of the plant between the palms of the hand or on rubber sheets.



Trends:

- Charas/Hashish is derived from the illicit cannabis cultivation being done by the drug traffickers at Kashmir Valley especially in the districts of South Kashmir and Kullu in Himachal Pradesh.
- There is a trend of trafficking of Charas from Kashmir and Himachal Pradesh to Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Goa & Gujarat and other metro towns of India.
- Charas is also trafficked from Nepal to India.





Significant seizures of Hashish:

On the basis of specific information the officers of Narcotics Control Bureau, Lucknow effected a seizure of total 60 KGs of Charas concealed/hidden in two different cars with registration no. UP-15-AD-8655 & UP-32-JL-1751, and intercepted 07 persons sitting in the said two cars at Dubagga Tiraha, near junction of IIM road & Hardoi road in Lucknow on 16.02.2019. On the basis of their voluntary statements, the above said persons were put under arrest on 16.02.2019 u/s 8/20/27A/29 of NDPS Act, 1985.

During investigation 03 persons out of 07, were found to be habitual trafficker, who were involved in trafficking of Charas in previous cases of NCB. They were kingpins and supplying Charas in 02 previous cases of NCB.

As the accused were found habitual drug traffickers, hence proposal for their detention under PITNDPS Act was sent to PITNDPS Cell, New Delhi & detention order was issued in the name of 02 accused out of the 07 accused.

This is one of the biggest seizures of Charas in the year by NCB, with arrests of both carriers and receiver of the drugs along with vehicles and the nexus between the drug traffickers was exposed.

Place of Seizure : Ban Toll Plaza,

On 19.03.2019, the officer of Narcotics Control Bureau, Zonal Unit Jammu recovered 74.500 Kgs of Charas from the possession of one accused at Ban Toll Plaza, Nagrota, Jammu and arrested him under section 8, 20, & 60 of NDPS Act-1985 on 19.03.2019. The vehicle which was used to carry out said charas was also seized by the NCB team. Further, on 20.03.2019 during the follow up action in this case, three persons were also arrested on 21.03.2019 under section 8, 20, & 60 of NDPS Act-1985.





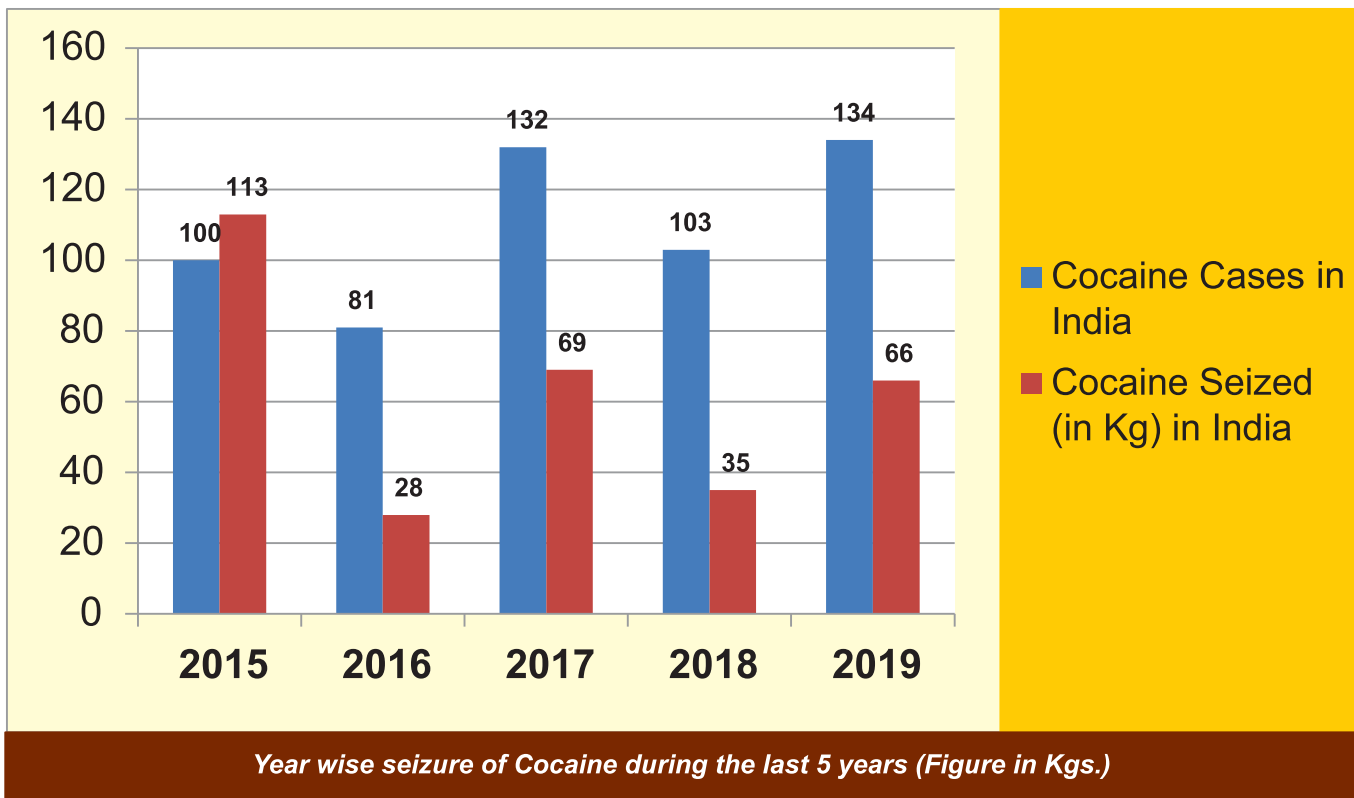
Trends:

- Major source of Cocaine in India are the South American countries
- Smuggling of cocaine is mostly being done by African nationals based in India.
- Instances of Cocaine being smuggled from Afghanistan, Argentina, Brazil and South America have also come to notice.
- Seizures of Cocaine in India have been made at airports mostly.
- There are many instances of small quantities of Cocaine trafficking through parcels concealed in common household articles like cosmetics, utensils, books and clothing.

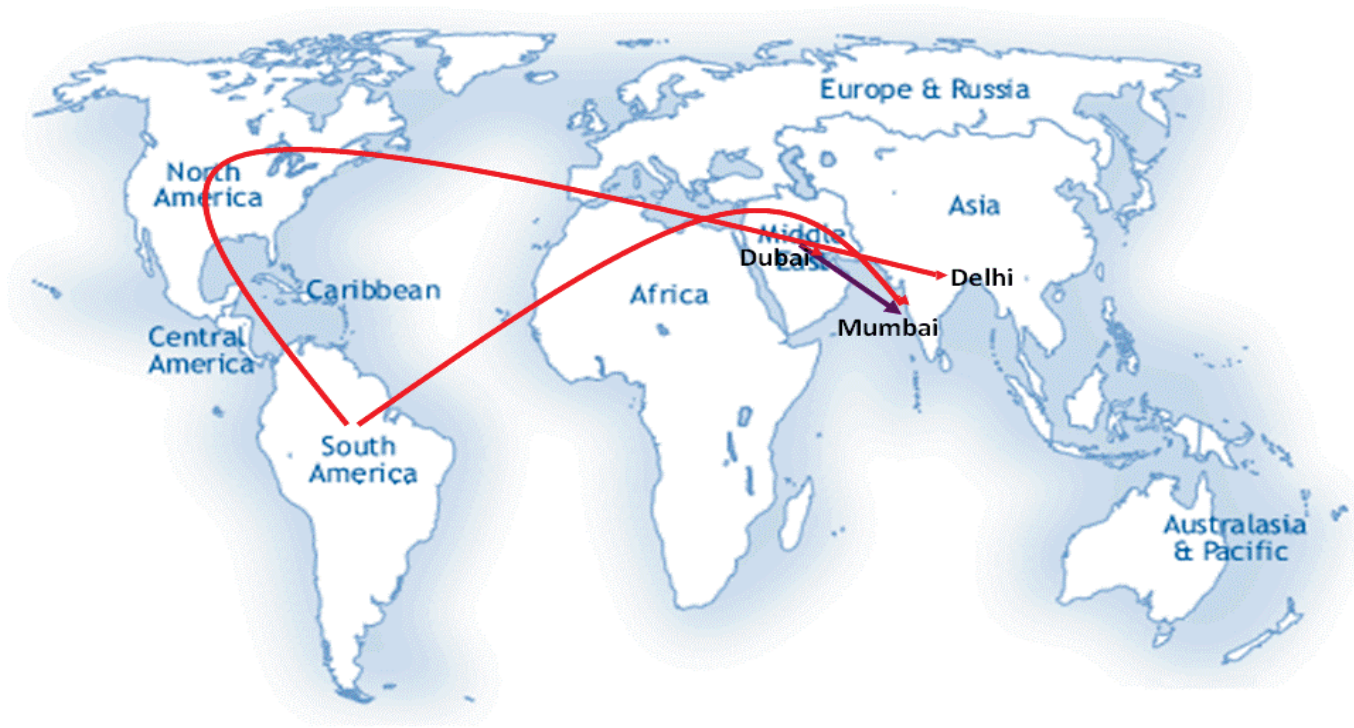
1.2.5 COCAINE

Cocaine is a **powerful addictive** stimulant drug manufactured from the leaves of the coca plant native to South America. As a street drug, cocaine looks like a fine, white, crystal powder. The primary markets are North America and Europe. In India, cultivation of coca plant is not done. However, Cocaine is mainly smuggled in by West African drug traffickers.

CASE STUDY-BIGGEST COCAINE SEIZURE

Seizure of 09.980 Kg of Cocaine by NCB Delhi Zone on 14.12.2019

On 04.12.2019, white coloured powder substance suspected to be cocaine weighing 9.980 kgs was recovered from the residence of the accused at House No. 537/3 Dundahera Village, P.S. Vijay Nagar, Ghaziabad, UP. The accused was living in a rented accommodation.

Preliminary investigation revealed that the suspected cocaine belonged to 3 persons & revelation were also made w.r.t. involvement of other 02 persons who were arrested. The 3 persons to whom the cocaine belonged were arrested by NCB Delhi.

In the course of the investigation, sample was sent to CRCL, New Delhi for analysis and confirmation. As per the report of the CRCL, New Delhi, the sample tested positive for cocaine, a

psychotropic substance.

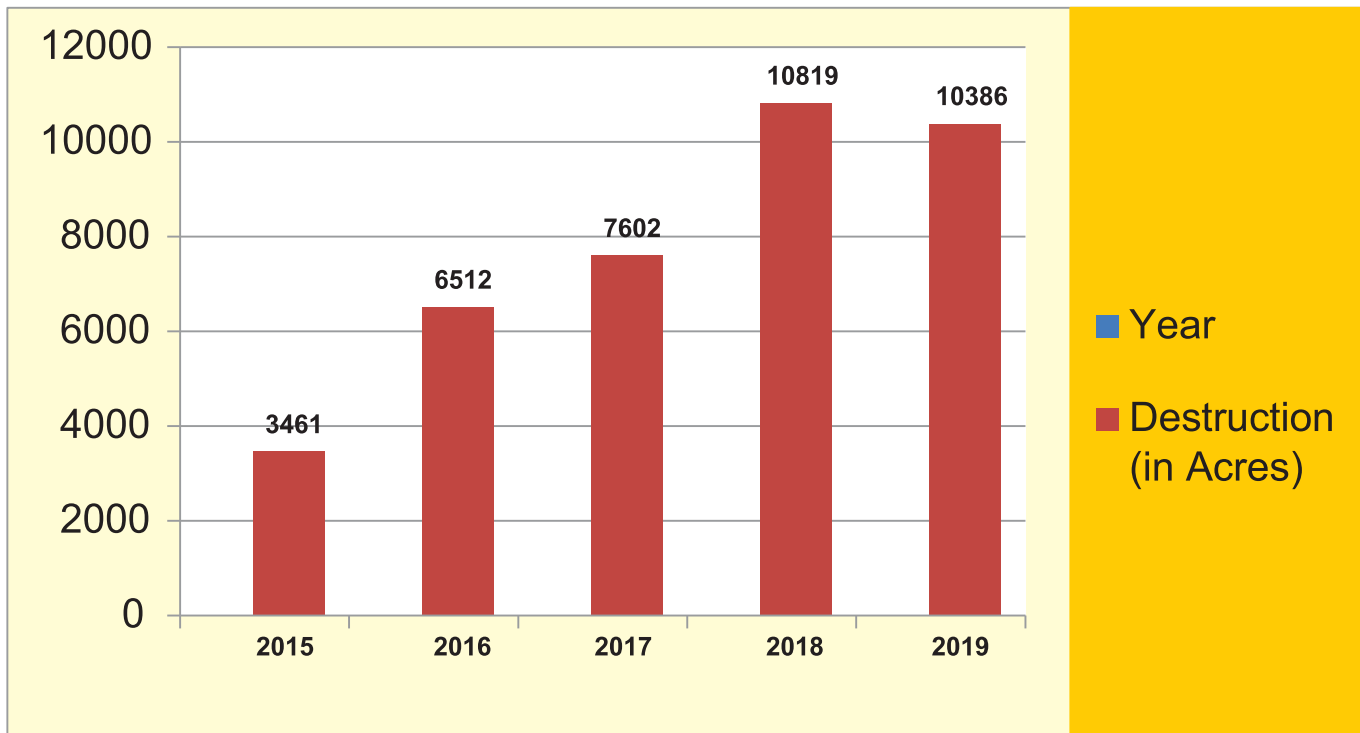
1.3 NARCOTIC CROPS

1.3.1 Licit Opium Poppy Cultivation

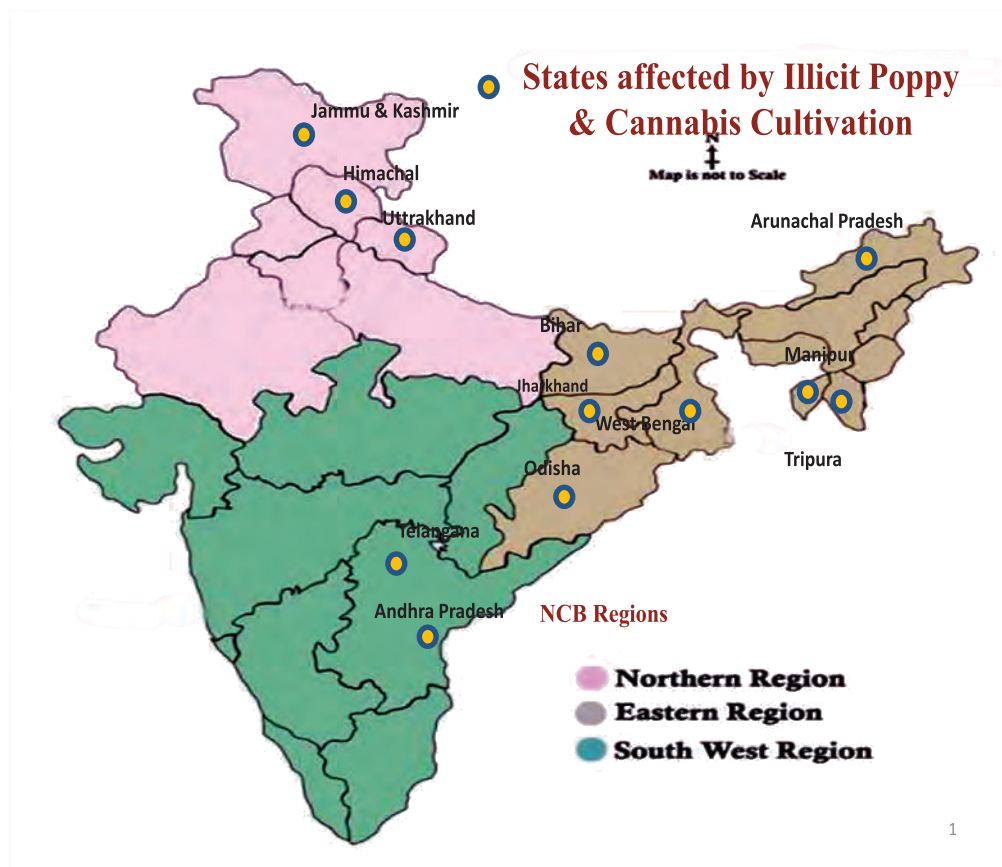
Licit Opium poppy cultivation takes place in a total of 16 districts distributed in the states of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. For the crop year 2018-19, the districts of Mandsaur, Neemuch & Ratlam in Madhya Pradesh; Kota, Baran, Jhalawar, Chittorgarh, Pratapgarh, Udaipur & Bhilwara in Rajasthan and Barabanki, Lucknow, Faizabad, Shahjahanpur, Badaun & Bareilly in Uttar Pradesh have been notified as the tracts within which the licit Opium cultivation in the country is to be undertaken. Licenses to grow opium are issued by the Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN) to cultivators who meet the general conditions required by the Government. During the crop year 2018-19 6949 Hectares area was licensed by CBN for cultivation of licit opium poppy but due to bad weather and diseases, 12% of poppy crop damaged and approximately 88% of the area licensed i.e about 6107 hectares has been area harvested as per CBN reporting.

1.3.2 Illicit Opium Poppy Cultivation

During 2019, illicit cultivation of opium poppy was found in the states of West Bengal, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Uttarakhand, Jharkhand, Bihar, Jammu & Kashmir, and Himachal Pradesh.

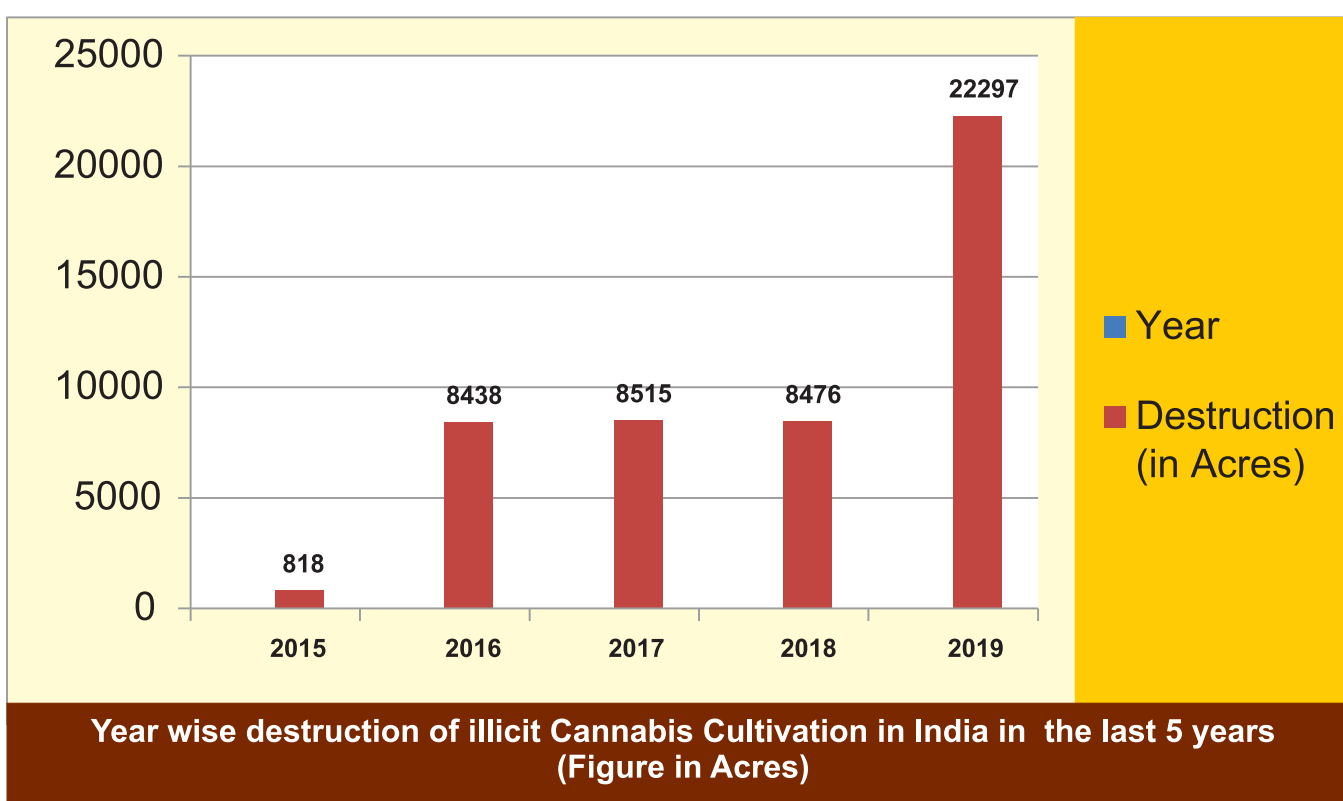

1.3.3 Illicit Cannabis Cultivation

Under the NDPS Act, as also under the UN Drug Control Conventions, the cultivation of Cannabis is illegal. One of the important countermeasures undertaken by NCB is to identify and destroy illicit cultivation of the plant. In 2019, the area under illicit cannabis cultivation was detected to be around 22297 acres, in the states of Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, West Bengal, Manipur, Tamil Nadu and Telangana which was subsequently destroyed by various Central & State agencies.



Destruction of illicit Cannabis cultivation

NCB Sub Zone Mandi lauched cannabis destruction in Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh along with State Police and Forest Deptt. during 1st phase in September, 2019.

1.4 PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES

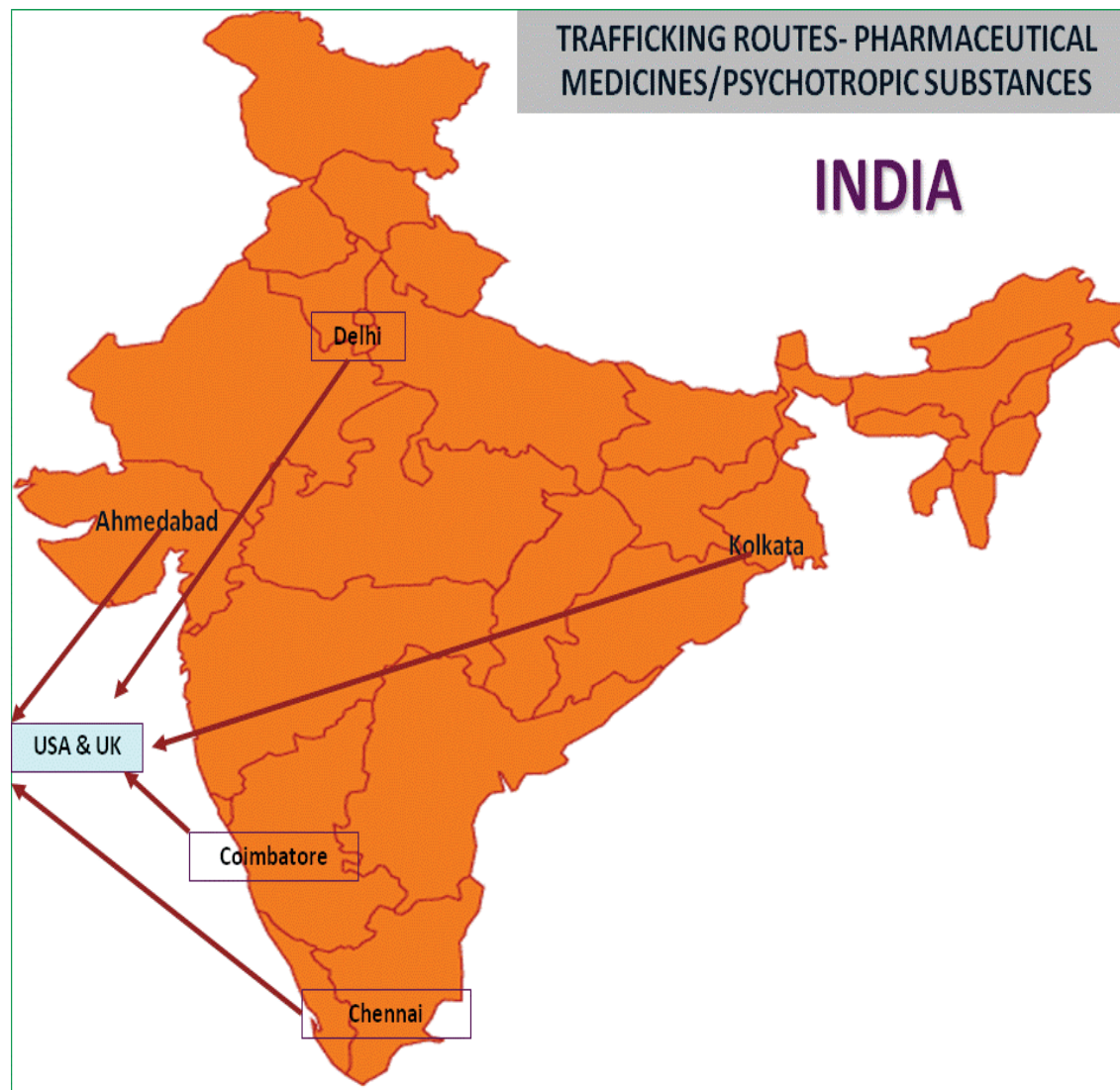
According to the NDPS Act, "psychotropic substance" means any substance, natural or synthetic, or any natural material or any salt or preparation of such substance or material included in the list of psychotropic substances specified in the Schedule. The Schedule includes substances like ATS, Methamphetamine, Methaqualone, Alprazolam, Diazepam, Buprenorphine, etc. A new psycho-active substance referred to as Mephedrone was newly included in the list of psychotropic substances, during the year 2016.

The Government of India has notified 13 substances on 27th February, 2018 under the NDPS Act, 1985. The details of which are as under:

1.4.1. Synthetic Drugs

The abuse of synthetic drugs is one of the fast emerging challenges for drug law enforcement agencies. Synthetic drugs like Amphetamine Type Stimulants (ATS) have become the drug of choice in South East Asia and in North America. In India, several attempts have been made in the past to set up clandestine manufacturing facilities, especially in Maharashtra and Gujarat to produce ATS.

Trends:

- Trafficking of ATS from Myanmar to India along North-Eastern Border States.
- Australia, Malaysia and Thailand are the major destination countries for ATS trafficking sourced from India.
- USA, Australia, Malaysia and South Africa are the major destination countries for Methaqualone/ Mandrax sourced from India.
- A major portion of Methaqualone/ Mandrax seizures are effected at Airports of New Delhi, Kolkata and Mumbai.

Significant seizures of Methaqualone:

- On 14.02.2019, officer of AIU, Customs Mumbai seized of 1.201 kg of Methaqualone and handed over the case to NCB Mumbai Zonal Unit for further investigation. 01 Venezuelan national was arrested.
- On 09.03.2019, Officers of Customs Airport, AIU, Trichy seized 9.934 kg of Methaqualone at Trichy Airport. 01 person was arrested. The suspected destination of the seized drug was Kuala Lumpur.
- On 13.03.2019 officers of NCB, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 2.000 kg of



Methaqualone at Gorakhpur Railway Station, UP. 03 persons were arrested.

- On 15.03.2019, Officers of Customs, Air Intelligence Unit, C.S.M.I, Airport, Mumbai seized 1.760 kg of Methaqualone. 01 Brazilian was arrested. The suspected source of the seized drug was Sao Paulo.
- On 08.05.2019, officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 1.600 kg of Methaqualone at IGI Airport, New Delhi. 01 person was arrested.
- On 22.07.2019, officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 1.150 kg of Methaqualone at DHL Express Pvt. Ltd. Kirti Nagar, New Delhi.
- On 22.12.2019, Officers of NCB, Kolkata Zonal Unit, in coordination with Indian Coast Guard seized 371.6 kg of Methaqualone. 06 Myanmarese nationals were arrested.

Significant seizures of Amphetamine Type Stimulants (ATS):

- On 13.01.2019, officers of Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Imphal seized 1,44,000 tablets of Amphetamine and 600 gram of Heroin at Imphal. 01 person was arrested. The suspected source of the seized drug was Myanmar.
- On 24.01.2019, officers of Customs, Imphal seized 50,000 tablets of Amphetamine at Chingmeirong near MBC Church, Imphal. 01 person was arrested. The suspected source of the seized drug was Myanmar.
- On 01.03.2019, officers of NCB, Guwahati Zonal Unit seized 1800 bottles of codeine based Cough Syrup and 68 gram tablets of Methamphetamine at Barsajai, Lalmati, Guwahati. 03 persons were arrested.
- On 17.03.2019, Officers of NCB, Kolkata Zonal Unit in co-ordination with BSF, Balupara, West Bengal seized 1.400 kg tablets of Methamphetamine. 01 person was arrested.
- On 22.03.2019, Officers of NCB, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 4.525 kg of Hashish, 965 gram of Amphetamine and 30 gram of Cocaine at Bangalore Airport. 02 persons were arrested. Further, in follow up operation 02 persons were also arrested.
- On 03.04.2019, officers of NCB, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 4.950 kg of Ephedrine & 1.090 kg of Amphetamine at DHL Couriers, Andheri. 01 Nigerian national was arrested in follow up. The suspected destination of the seized drug was Australia & New Zealand.
- On 07.04.2019, officers of Custom, Agartala seized 2.800 kg tablets of Methamphetamine at Sepahijala, Tripura. 01 person was arrested. The suspected source of the seized drug was Myanmar and destined to Bangladesh.
- On 14.05.2019, Officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 500 gram of Amphetamine at DHL Exp pvt. Ltd. 71/3, Rama Road New Delhi.
- On 11.06.2019, officers of NCB, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 850 gram of Amphetamine at DHL Express (India) Pvt. Ltd., Andheri (East), Mumbai.
- On 11.06.2019, Officers of NCB, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 290 gram of Amphetamine at DTDC Express Pvt. Ltd., Goregoan, Mumbai.

NCB Kolkata Zonal Unit seized of 371.6 kg (approx) white crystalline powder believed to be Methaqualone on 22.12.2019 at ICGS Aruna Asaf Ali, Coast Guard District HQ-14. The source of the drug was Myanmar.

Acting on a specific input from the Indian Coast Guard, Andaman & Nicobar regarding recovery of huge quantity of Narcotics Drugs in white colour Crystalline form. During rummaging of the suspicious boat by the team, 356 packets containing suspected white crystalline substance were recovered. 6 Mayanmarese Nationals were arrested.





Significant seizures of Ketamine:

- On 30.04.2019, officers of NCB, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 26.750 kg of Ketamine at Majestic, Bangalore. 01 person was arrested. Further in follow up operation 25.450 kg of Ketamine was seized and busted one illegal clandestine laboratory at Hyderabad on 01.05.2019. The suspected destination of the seized drug was New Malaysia.
- On 03.05.2019, officers of NCB, Hyderabad Sub Zone seized 477 kg of Ketamine along with 281.150 kg of intermediate material at Hyderabad. 01 person was arrested.
- On 14.04.2018, officers of Customs, Airport Special Cargo, Mumbai intercepted a parcel at M/s Fedex, IBI House, Chimatpada, Andheri (E), Mumbai and seized 3.880 kg of Ketamine. 01 person was arrested. The suspected destination of the seized drug was Canada.
- On 28.07.2019, officers of DRI, Chennai seized 1.475 kg of Ketamine at DRI, 27, G.N. Chetty Road, T. Nagar, Chennai. 02 persons were arrested.
- On 21.09.19 NCB, KZU, Kolkata seized 1156 Kg white colour crystalline substance believed to be Ketamine at ICGS Rajveer, Haddo, A&N, Pin-744102. 06 foreigners i.e., Myanmar nationals were arrested in the case.
- On 10.12.2019, Officers of NCB, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 106 gram of Ketamine at Banaswadi, Bangalore. In follow up action 6.8 gram of Hashish and 1.7 gram of Amphetamine was seized. 01 person was arrested.

CASE STUDY-BIGGEST KETAMINE SEIZURE

Seizure of 1156 Kg of Ketamine by NCB Kolkata Zone

Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Kolkata Zonal Unit seized 1156 Kg of Methamphetamine on 21.09.2019 at Port Blair, A&N Island and arrested six Burmese nationals.

Gist of joint interrogation:

- Joint interrogation of 06 Myanmar nationals was conducted. It was learnt that 58 bags of contraband items were to be delivered at sea near Malaysian and Thailand coastal border and the six apprehended Burmese person were not informed about the recipient party at Malaysia. The Boat master was directed by the owner of the boat to position themselves at a particular GPS Coordinates near Malaysia and Thailand coastal border and to flash red light on the hood of the cabin intermittently. As per plan they were scheduled to reach Malaysia on 21.09.2019 night and were supposed to carry out the signaling procedure. From the joint interrogation it is also revealed that the boat did not have any registration under IMO nor any kind of certificate was issued by the Union of Myanmar. The 06 apprehended Myanmar nationals also did not have any passports or Malaysian Visa or Indian Visa. The boat is owned by a Myanmar national.
- During BIMSTEC conference in 2020 at New Delhi, Myanmar authority informed that they imposed money laundering Act against the owner of the boat but he could not be arrested.

1.5 CLANDESTINE LABORATORIES/ FACTORIES

Seizure by Bangalore Zone

On the basis of specific information, the officers of NCB, Bangalore Zonal Unit seized 26.750 kg of Ketamine on 30.04.2019. Subsequent follow up action resulted in the further recovery and seizure of 25.450 Kg of Ketamine, raw material and equipment from a clandestine lab found in basement of a rental house Rajarajeshwari Nagar, Bangalore on 01.05.2019.

In this connection three persons were arrested. The receiver (resident of Chennai), supplier (resident of Bangalore) and the person (resident of Hyderabad) who had trained the supplier in illegal manufacturing of seized Ketamine were arrested on 01.05.2019, 03.05.2019 and 05.05.2019 respectively.

On the basis of revelations of the supplier, a unit in the name and style of M/s. Inchem Laboratories at Nacharam, Hyderabad was searched, which resulted in the recovery and seizure of 477 kg of crystalline powder purported to be Ketamine or Clenbuterol. Subsequent chemical analysis report confirmed that the seized item was not Ketamine.

The main kingpin in this case is a resident of Chennai (now residing in Australia) who had introduced the supplier to the person operating a chemical unit at Hyderabad for manufacturing of Ketamine. The kingpin operating from Australia got the illicit Ketamine manufactured and arranged the customers. He used to send money through Hawala to the supplier in this case for manufacturing and delivery at Bangalore.



• 1.6 P r e c u r s o r Chemicals

• Trends:

- Trafficking of Ephedrine / Pseudoephedrine is carried out mainly through Delhi, Chennai, Cochin and Airports.
- There are instances of use of courier/ parcels also.

Significant seizures of Ephedrine/ Pseudoephedrine:

- On 10.01.2019, officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 24.500 kg of Pseudo Ephedrine at IGI Airport, New Delhi. 01 Tanzanian national was arrested. The suspected destination of the seized drug was Tanzania.
- On 27.01.2019, officers of NCB, Madurai Sub Zone seized 6.600 kg of Pseudo Ephedrine. 01 person was arrested. The suspected destination of the seized drug was Malaysia.

- On 11.12.2019, Officers of NCB, Chennai Zonal Unit seized 3.270 kg of Methamphetamine, 25.670 kg of Ephedrine, 270 gram of Hashish & 20 tablets of Alprazolam at parking area of Preetha Garden Hotel, Avadi, Chennai. 01 person was arrested.

CASE STUDY-BIGGEST PSEUDOEPHEDRINE SEIZURE

Seizure of 24.7 + 1818 Kg of Psuedoephedrine by NCB Delhi Zone

- On 09.05.2019, various drugs including 24.700 Kgs suspected Pseudo-Ephedrine was recovered from the possession of a person at IGI Airport, New Delhi.
- Based on his disclosure, house search was conducted at the rented residence in Greater Noida, District Gautam Budh Nagar, U.P. During the search suspected Pseudo-Ephedrine weighing 1818 kgs was recovered from the bathroom of the residence. Also, 138 kgs of an unknown substance suspected to be a banned drug, 1.9 kgs suspected cocaine
- Based on the disclosure of the person residing in the rented place, search was again conducted in the basement of the House at Greater Noida, District

Gautam Budh Nagar, U.P. and 2 strips of Alprazolam tablets 10 tablets each, 1.8 kgs suspected morphine, 88 kgs suspected PseudoEphedrine and 3.750 kgs suspected Acetic Anhydride were recovered under the construction materials which were found there at the basement. Both the person along with the co-conspirator were arrested.



1.7 PHARMACEUTICAL DRUGS

The abuse of pharmaceutical drugs in India has assumed serious proportions in recent times. The problem seems to be serious in the North-east and North-west region of the country. The pharmaceutical products that are abused include Buprenorphine, Codeine-based cough syrups, Alprazolam, Diazepam and other sedatives. The easy availability of such preparations is the major factor that encourages their misuse. There is also a perception that these pharmaceutical drugs are less harmful than hard drugs like Heroin, Cocaine, etc. However, this is a misconception, since these can be addictive and also have a debilitating effect on health. Pharmaceutical preparations

having narcotic / psychotropic substances are under the purview of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, and the NDPS Act in India.

Law enforcement agencies have also seized sizeable quantities of Alprazolam tablets, Zolpidem, Tramadol tablets, Stidonafil tablets, etc.

Significant seizures of Pharmaceutical Drugs (Tablets):

- On 24.01.2019, officers of NCB, NCB, Guwahati Zonal Unit seized 1,000 bottles of Phensedyl Cough Syrup and 11,520 tablets of Spasmoproxyvan named Sposwon Plus at Khanapara, Guwahati. 01 person was arrested.
- On 30.01.2019, officers of NCB, Imphal Sub Zone in coordination with Assam Rifles seized 6.160 kg (64,000 Nos.) tablets of WY. 01 person was arrested. The suspected source of the seized drug was Myanmar.
- On 10.02.2019, officers of NCB, Lucknow Zonal Unit seized 100 gram of Heroin and 200 gram of Alprazolam at Basti toll plaza, Basti, UP. 04 persons were arrested.
- On 17.04.2019, officers of NCB Imphal Sub Zone in coordination with Assam Rifles, Kheingjang Post, Churachandpur, Manipur seized 1.470 kg of Heroin and 4.758 kg tablets of WY. 01 person was arrested. The suspected source of the seized drug was Myanmar and destined to Bangladesh.
- On 06.05.2019, officers of NCB, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 20,000 capsules of Pervorin-Spas and 1,00,000 tablets of Clavidol-100 SR (containing Tramadol) from 04 vehicles in front of Raj Road Carrier, TPT Nagar, Ludhiana, Punjab. 06 persons were arrested.
- On 13.05.2019, officers of NCB, Hyderabad Sub Zone in coordination with C.I. Cell, Hyderabad seized 9.920 kg of Alprazolam, 1.010 kg of Ephedrine at Kompally Village, Medchal-Malkajgiri Dist., Telangana. 07 persons were arrested along with 03 vehicles.
- On 27.05.2019, Officers of NCB, Kolkata Zonal Unit, seized 475 gram (loose) & 470 tablets of Zolpidem, 600 tablets of Alprazolam, 660 tablets of Lorazepam, 460 tablets of Tramadol along with 01 Mobile and 01 Laptop at DHL Express India Pvt. Ltd., DN-53, Sector-V, Salt Lake City, Kolkata. 01 person has been arrested in this case.
- On 26.06.2019, Officers of NCB, Chennai Zonal Unit seized 1,000 tablets of Tramadol at DHL Express Indian Pvt. Ltd., 80 feet Scheme road, Gandhinagar, Trruppur, Tamil Naddu.
- On 06.07.2019, officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 5000 tablets of Alprazolam from DTDC Courier Company at Khasra no. 16/6, Telephone Exchange Road, Village – Samlkha, New Delhi.
- On 17-18.09.2019, NCB Hyderabad Sub-Zone effected seizure of 220.5 Gm of Chlordiazepoxide (Librium 25) tablets at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport, Hyderabad and arrested one Somalian national in this connection.
- On 01.10.19, Officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 18,500 tablets of Psychotropic Substances at Lajpat Nagar, New Delhi. 03 persons were arrested.
- On 15.10.2019, Officers of Central Bureau of Narcotics, Preventive and Intelligence Cell, New Delhi seized 7,55,423 tablets & ampoules of Psychotropic Substances and 9,746 bottles of Codeine Phosphate Cough Syrup at M/s RND Distributors, A-1, LSC Market, Mangolpuri, New Delhi. 01 person was arrested.

- On 16.10.2019, Officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 10 bottles of Codeine based Cough Syrup , 120 capsules of Tramadol & 12 injections of Tramadol.
- On 16.10.2019, Officers of Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Chennai seized 1,37,665 tablets of Psychotropic Substances at Chennai. 03 persons were arrested. The suspected destination of the seized drug was USA.
- On 26.10.2019, Officers of NCB, Chandigarh Zonal Unit seized 10,800 tablets of Tramadol and 1.700 kg of Poppy Straw. 02 persons were arrested.
- On 11.11.2019, Officers of NCB, Delhi Zonal Unit seized 1200 tablets of Zolpidem at DHL Express India Pvt. Ltd, Rama road, Industrial Area, New Delhi.
- On 12.11.2019, Officers of NCB, Hyderabad Sub Zone seized 498 tablets of Alprazolam at DHL Hyderabad office.
- On 11.12.2019, Officers of NCB, Mumbai Zonal Unit seized 9000 tablets of Tramadol at Foreign Post office, Mumbai.

1.8 INTERNET PHARMACY

The emergence of illegal websites established in the USA, Europe etc. offering unregulated trade in a range of prescription medicines over the internet has taken firm root in India as a supplier. These online pharmacies transmit orders from paying customers to agents in India, who then procure the medicines from either legitimate or illegitimate sources before dispatching them to customers by mail and courier. The sheer volume of international post makes it impossible to screen every parcel and hence a vast majority of

illegal consignments passes by undetected by the authorities.

Internet pharmacies are usually highly vulnerable and keep the identity of organizers tightly veiled. In India, nevertheless, the NCB either on its own or in coordination with the outside agencies has been making at least one bust every year over the years.

1.9 CONTROLLED DELIVERY

Controlled Delivery is a technique which allows illicit or suspect consignments of Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, controlled substances or substances substituted for them to pass out of, or through or into the territory of India with the knowledge and under the supervision of an officer empowered in this behalf or duly authorized under section 50A with a view to identifying the persons involved in the commission of an offence under this Act;

The Director General of Narcotics Control Bureau constituted under sub-section (3) of section 4 or any other officer authorized by him in this behalf, may, notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, undertake controlled delivery of any consignment to:

- (a) any destination in India
- (b) a foreign country, in consultation with the competent authority of such foreign country to which such consignment is destined, in such manner as may be prescribed.

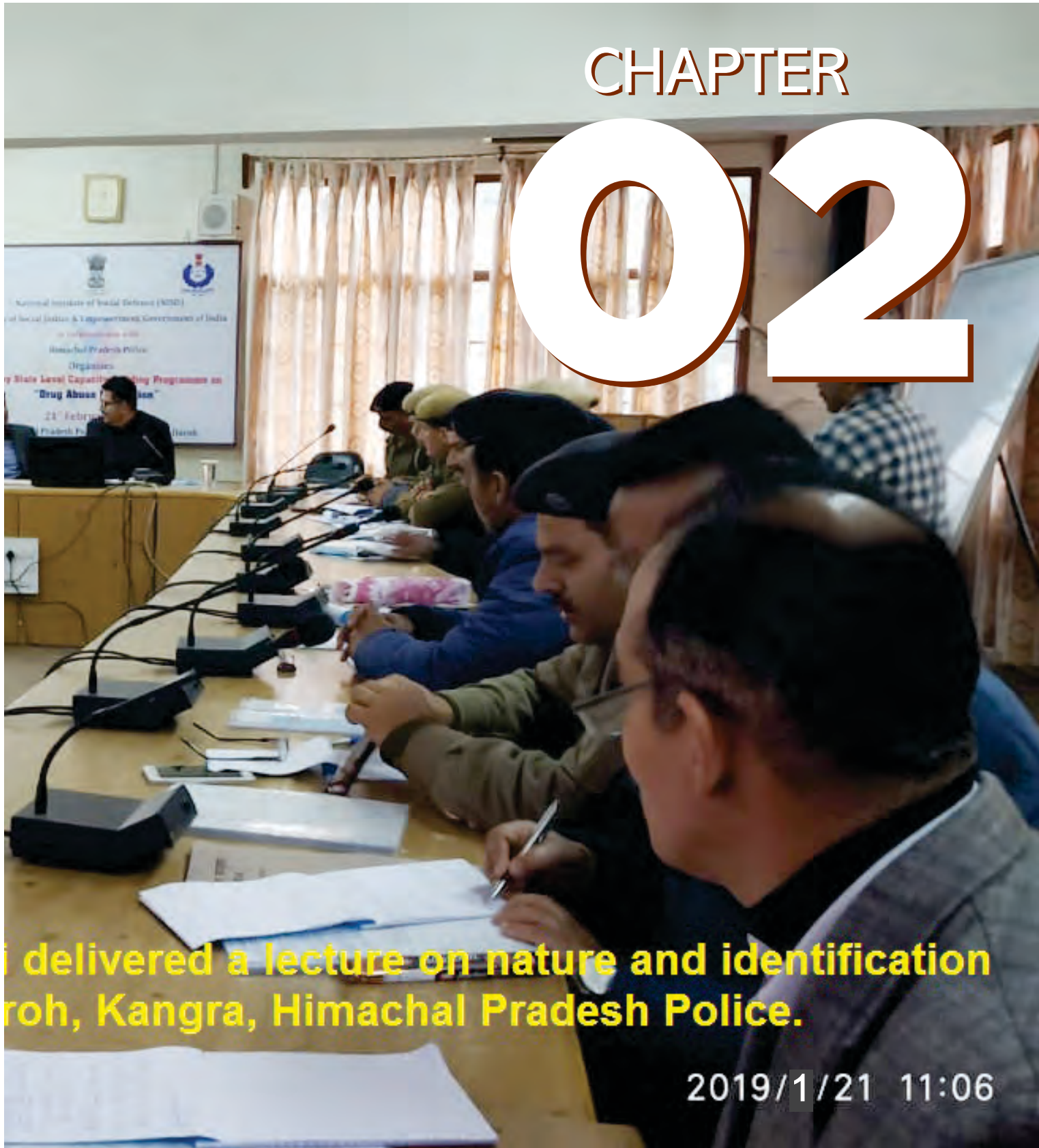

2. CAPACITY BUILDING

2.1 TRAINING

Training programmes are conducted by the Policy & Co-ordination wing of Narcotics Control Bureau, through a variety of channels. In India, the officers working for drug law enforcement include officers from Central and State Government agencies which include the following:-

- Narcotics Control Bureau
- Customs and Central Excise
- Department of Revenue Intelligence
- Border Guarding Forces
- State Police
- State Excise
- State Drug Controller, etc.
- Common training requirements of the above mentioned agencies include, training on the principal laws like Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, PITNDPS Act, 1988, Regulation of Controlled Substances Order (RCS Order), 2013, Circular/ notifications, documentation procedures, emergence of New Psychoactive Substances (NPS), precursor control mechanism, collection of intelligence, National/ International trends in drug trafficking, the study of reasons for acquittal of cases.
- NCB conducts regular short duration training programmes for such field officials, either by itself or in co-ordination with other authorities like National Academy for Custom, Excise and Narcotics(NACEN), Intelligence Bureau(IB), Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), North Eastern Police Academy(NEPA), National Institute of Criminology and Forensic Sciences (NICFS), Central Academy of Police Training (CAPT), National Forensic Science University (NFSU), Border Guarding Forces, State Police Training Centres, etc.
- These programmes also provide a platform for sharing of best practices of the agencies in their respective areas of strength.
- Some outcomes of such training are:
 - Increase knowledge of drug law enforcement.
 - Enhancement of professional skills in detecting/investigating drug offence cases.
 - Enhancement of intelligence collection and analysis skills.
 - Identification of the trends and patterns of drug tracking, and patterns and the dynamics of drug tracking, etc.
 - Understanding, planning and executing "Controlled Delivery" Operations.
 - Better understanding of drugs, precursors and clandestine labs.
 - Knowledge of various interdiction techniques.
 - NCB also provides 'resource persons' and training materials to other sister

- organizations like NACEN, CBI Academy, NICFS, BSF, SSB, NPA and State Police Academies for specialized training in drug law enforcement.
- COMPUTER BASED TRAINING (CBT)
 - The Computer Based Training (CBT) is a part of UNODC Global e-Learning Programme which began in June 2010 for imparting training to the law enforcement officers across the globe on various subjects related to drug trafficking. NCB has set up 12 CBT centres in coordination with UNODC at NCB Headquarters, New Delhi and NCB Zonal Units at Kolkata, Chennai, Bangalore, Chandigarh, Indore, Guwahati, Jodhpur, Lucknow, Jammu, Patna and Ahmedabad.
 - CBT modules cover all aspects of drug law enforcement including intelligence, investigation, precursor tracking and anti money laundering. The CBT is a hands on training module, where a learner can learn by committing mistakes. The interactive nature of the modules facilitates enhanced retention.
 - The module has pre and post test scores/ sessions which enables the administrator to assess the impact of learning process.
 - During this period, NCB conducted 304 Training Programmes all over India. A total of 11,669 persons participated in the training programmes.

2.2 ASSISTANCE TO STATES

The grant under the "Assistance to States & UTs" scheme is subject to establishment of the following institutional mechanism:

1. Formation of an Apex Level Committee under the Chief Secretary/Senior Secretary of respective States/ UTs to draw up a strategy to combat both drug abuse and supply of drugs.
2. Setting up of an Anti Narcotics Task Force under an IG/DIG level officer.
3. Formulation of a 3/5-year Action Plan for the above purpose.

As per the scheme, financial assistance is given for procurement of items like Surveillance equipment, Laboratory equipment, Vehicle for patrolling/Surveillance, Computers and their accessories, Fax machine and photocopiers, Training equipment and other aids, Other equipment useful for enforcement.

The Scheme was initially launched during 2004-05, with a budget of Rs 10 crore for a period of five years. In 2009, the scheme was further extended for another five year term with an enhanced budget of Rs. 15 crore. Further, the scheme was extended for a period of three years viz. from 2014-15 to 2016-17 with budget of Rs. 15 crores.

NCB had requested MHA for extension of scheme "Assistance to States & UTs", for another term of five years. However, the same was extended by MHA, for another period of three years i.e. 2017-2020 with an estimated budget of Rs. 21 crores.

The implementation of the scheme is monitored by NCB. States that avail central assistance under this scheme are required to furnish performance reports and utilization certificates.

As on 31st March, 2019, financial assistance for Rs. 39,85,73,057/- has been provided to the States & UTs since start of the scheme in 2004.

2.4 DRUG DEMAND REDUCTION

Demand Reduction refers to the steps taken by any agency to reduce demand for consumption of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances. The demand reduction strategy is in addition to the supply reduction strategy which focuses on drug interdiction.

The Government of India has mandated the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MSJ&E) to run different demand reduction programmes.

The measures adopted for demand reduction include:

- Awareness building and educating people about harmful consequences of narcotic drugs
- Community-based intervention for identification, treatment, motivation, counselling and rehabilitation of drug addicts
- Training of volunteers/service providers and other stakeholders.

Demand Reduction Programmes by NCB

Apart from its regular work in the field of drug

interdiction, NCB does some work in spreading awareness among the masses by way of various programmes. These programmes include:

- Street Plays/ Cultural Programmes
- Run against drug abuse
- Display of Awareness Board in Pub, Bar and Airport, etc.
- Painting and slogan writing competition
- Pledge taking ceremonies
- Display of banners and posters at prominent public places
- Publication of Advertorial in leading newspaper
- Transmission of Anti-Drug Message through Radio channel
- SMS alert about drug awareness
- Observance of 26 June as 'International Day Against Drug Abuse & Illicit Trafficking' to create awareness

During 2019, NCB carried out 378 awareness and educational programmes as part of drug demand reduction activities across the country, covering approximately 66,965 participants.

3.1.3 JUDICIAL COOPERATION

a) **Controlled Delivery Operations:**

NCB conducts Controlled delivery operations in coordination with other countries. The Director General, Narcotics Control Bureau is empowered under Section 50A of the NDPS Act, 1985 to authorize "controlled delivery" of any contraband drugs to India or abroad.

b) **Mutual Legal Assistance:**

Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty (MLAT) is an agreement between two countries for gathering and transfer of evidence. Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty usually provides the framework to facilitate the widest measure of mutual assistance in:

- taking evidence or statements from persons;
- effecting service of judicial documents;
- executing searches and seizures;
- examining objects and sites;
- providing information and evidentiary items;
- providing originals or certified copies of the relevant documents and records including bank, financial, corporate, and business records;
- identifying or tracing proceeds, property, instrumentalities or other things for evidentiary purposes;
- The specific form of Mutual Legal Assistance that can be given or obtained depends on the provisions of the treaty with the foreign government.
- India has signed Mutual Legal Assistance Treaties with 40 countries.

- The Indian Extradition Act contains a provision in terms of which extradition can be considered even in the absence of an extradition treaty if the offence for which extradition has been sought is included in any international convention to which both India and the other country seeking extradition are parties.

3.1.4 INCB/UNODC Reporting

- Being a signatory to the various international conventions on narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, India is under obligation to submit the required information to the United Nations office of Drugs Crime (UNODC) and International Narcotics Control

Board (INCB) in the prescribed formats. NCB is the nodal/central agency for implementation of the India's obligations under various international conventions.

International Narcotics Control Board (INCB)

To meet the international obligations under the UN Conventions on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, Convention on Psychotropic Substances, 1971 and United Nations Convention against Illicit traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, 1988, NCB submits seven reports in the prescribed formats namely Form A, B, C, D, P, A/P and B/P to INCB Vienna. Form A & A/P relates to Import & Export of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, respectively, and the same are being submitted to INCB on quarterly basis. The other Forms i.e B, C, D & P is being submitted to INCB on an annual basis and relates to annual assessment/estimates of narcotics drugs and psychotropic substances in different fields. While Form B/P is being submitted once in 3 years which relates to annual assessment of medical and scientific requirement of scheduled substances. Inputs on the different Forms come from Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN), the

Chief Controller of Factories (CCF) and the Drug Controller General of India (DCGI).

United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC)

Every member country has to provide inputs in the Annual Report Questionnaire (ARQ) every year on the working of the international drug control treaties to UNODC.

The ARQ has four parts detailed below:

Part-I Legislative and Institutional framework
Part-II Comprehensive approach to drug demand & supply reduction

Part-III Drug Abuse situation, extent, pattern and trends of drug abuse

Part-IV Illicit supply of drugs - Extent, pattern and trends in illicit drug cultivation, manufacture and Trafficking.

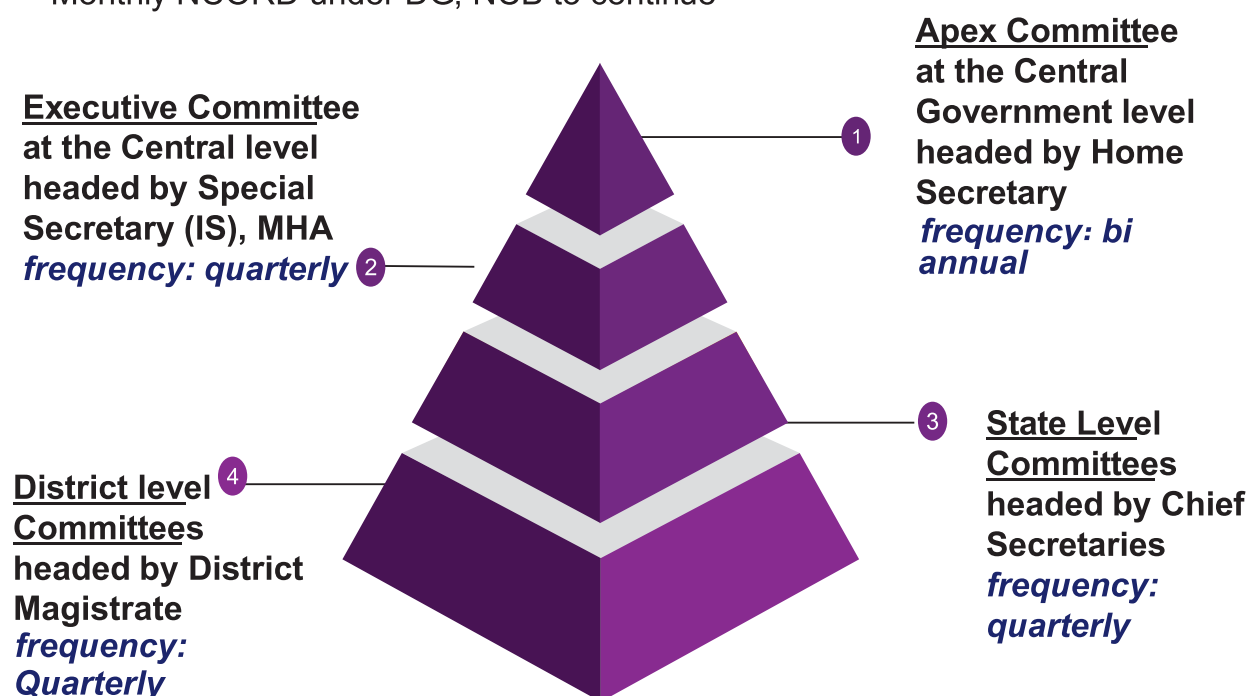

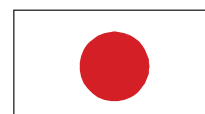

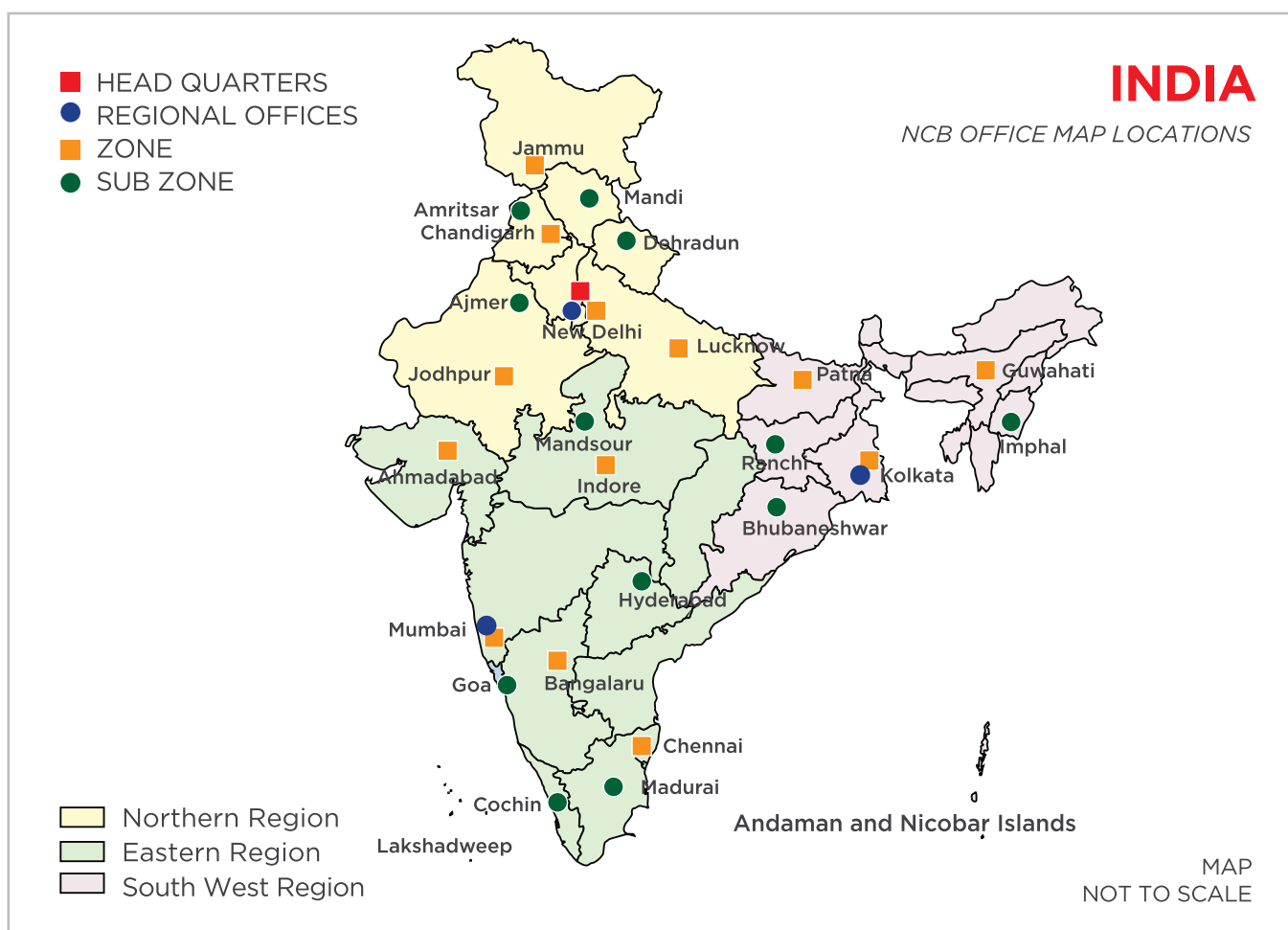


4. ORGANISATION

4.1 NCB CHARTER

In exercise of powers under Section 4 of NDPS Act, 1985, the 'NARCOTICS CONTROL BUREAU' was constituted with Headquarters at Delhi with effect from 17th Mar, 1986. The Bureau, subject to the supervision and control of the Central Government, is to exercise powers and functions of the Central Government for taking measures with respect to:

- Co-ordination of actions by various offices, State Governments and other authorities under the N.D.P.S. Act, Customs Act, Drugs and Cosmetics Act and any other law for the time being in force in connection with the enforcement provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985.
- Implementation of the obligation in respect of counter measures against illicit traffic under the various international conventions and protocols that are in force at present or which may be ratified or acceded to by India in future.



- Assistance to concerned authorities in foreign countries and concerned international organizations to facilitate coordination and universal action for prevention and suppression of illicit traffic in these drugs and substances.
- Coordination of actions taken by other concerned Ministries, Departments and Organizations in respect of matters relating to drug abuse.

On the recommendation of the Group of Ministers (GoM) on national security, NCB was transferred from Department of Revenue (DoR) to Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on 18.02.2003.

4.2 NCB ORGANISATION

The NCB was established in 1986, with a sanctioned strength of 164 and Zonal Units at Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai, Mumbai and Varanasi. Later new zones were sanctioned at Jodhpur, Chandigarh, Jammu, Ahmadabad, Indore, Guwahati, Patna and Bangalore whereas the Varanasi zone was shifted to Lucknow. Besides the office of three Deputy Director Generals (Regional) were created, one each in Delhi, Kolkata and Mumbai. Sub zones at Dehradun, Amritsar, Mandi, Ajmer, Ranchi, Bhubaneswar, Imphal, Goa, Mandsaur, Cochin, Madurai and Hyderabad has been created during last decade. At present, the sanctioned strength of NCB is 1107.

- The Mega Proposal i.e., expansion of NCB in three phases has been sent to MHA with creation of Chemical Analyst Wing, Prosecution Wing, Cyber Wing, Drug Intelligence Wing, Computer/IT Cadre and Canine Squad.
- Details of the posts filled by deputation in 2019 are as under:-
- Deputy Director/Zonal Director – 4, Intelligence Officer – 34, Junior Intelligence Officer – 58, Surveillance Assistant – 3, Assistant – 1, Driver – 13, Havaladar – 1 and Sepoy – 12.
- In 2019, promotion of the following posts have takes place:-
 - Superintendent to Assistant Director (08 personnel).
 - Intelligence Officer to Superintendent (14 personnel).
 - Lower Division Clerk to Upper Division Clerk (01 personnel)
 - Sepoy to Havaladar (01 personnel).

4.3 INFRASTRUCTURE/PROJECTS

- Construction work of Office cum Residential Complex (OCR) at Chandigarh Zone has been completed about 95% by the end of 2019.
- Construction work for Office cum Residential Complex (OCR) at Ahmadabad Zone has been completed about 99% by the end of calendar year 2019.
- Construction work of Office Complexe (OC) at Indore Zone is under progress & constructed about 10%.

- Construction work of Office Complex (OC) at Bhubaneswar Sub-Zone is under progress & constructed about 10%.
- Land for construction of Office cum Residential Complexes (OCR) have been acquired at Bangalore and Guwahati Zones.

4.4 SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAN

On the occasion of the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi on 02.10.2019, special cleanliness drives under "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" were conducted at NCB Headquarters, Zonal Units and Sub-Zones.

4.5 INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

On the occasion of International Yoga Day on 21st June 2019, Yoga sessions were organised at NCB premises for the NCB personnel.



4.6 राजभाषा हिंदी

ब्यूरो मुख्यालय के सभी उप महानिदेशक के कार्यालयों, क्षेत्रीय एवं उप क्षेत्रीय कार्यालयों से राजभाषा प्रयोग संबंधी तिमाही प्रगति रिपोर्टें नियमित रूप से मँगवाई गई। उप महानिदेशक (उत्तरी क्षेत्र), उप महानिदेशक (दक्षिण पश्चिमी क्षेत्र) व उप महानिदेशक (पूर्वी क्षेत्र) के कार्यालयों तथा क्षेत्रीय कार्यालयों की वर्ष 2019 में सभी तिमाहियों की राजभाषायी रिपोर्टों की मदवार विस्तारपूर्वक समीक्षा की गई तथा पाई गई कमियों को दूर करने हेतु सुझाव दिए गए।

रिपोर्टों को समय पर राजभाषा विभाग के संबंधित क्षेत्रीय कार्यान्वयन कार्यालयों को भिजवाने के भी निर्देश दिए गए। अधिकतर कार्यालय अपनी रिपोर्ट संबंधित क्षेत्रीय कार्यान्वयन कार्यालयों को भिजवा रहे हैं।

नगर राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति

स्वापक नियंत्रण ब्यूरो का कार्यालय, नगर राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति, दक्षिण दिल्ली- ॥ का सदस्य है। अध्यक्ष कार्यालय तथा नोडल कार्यालय को तिमाही रिपोर्टें, छमाही रिपोर्टें समीक्षा के लिए भिजवाई गई एवं उन पर अपेक्षित अनुवर्ती कार्रवाई भी की गई।

हिंदी प्रशिक्षण

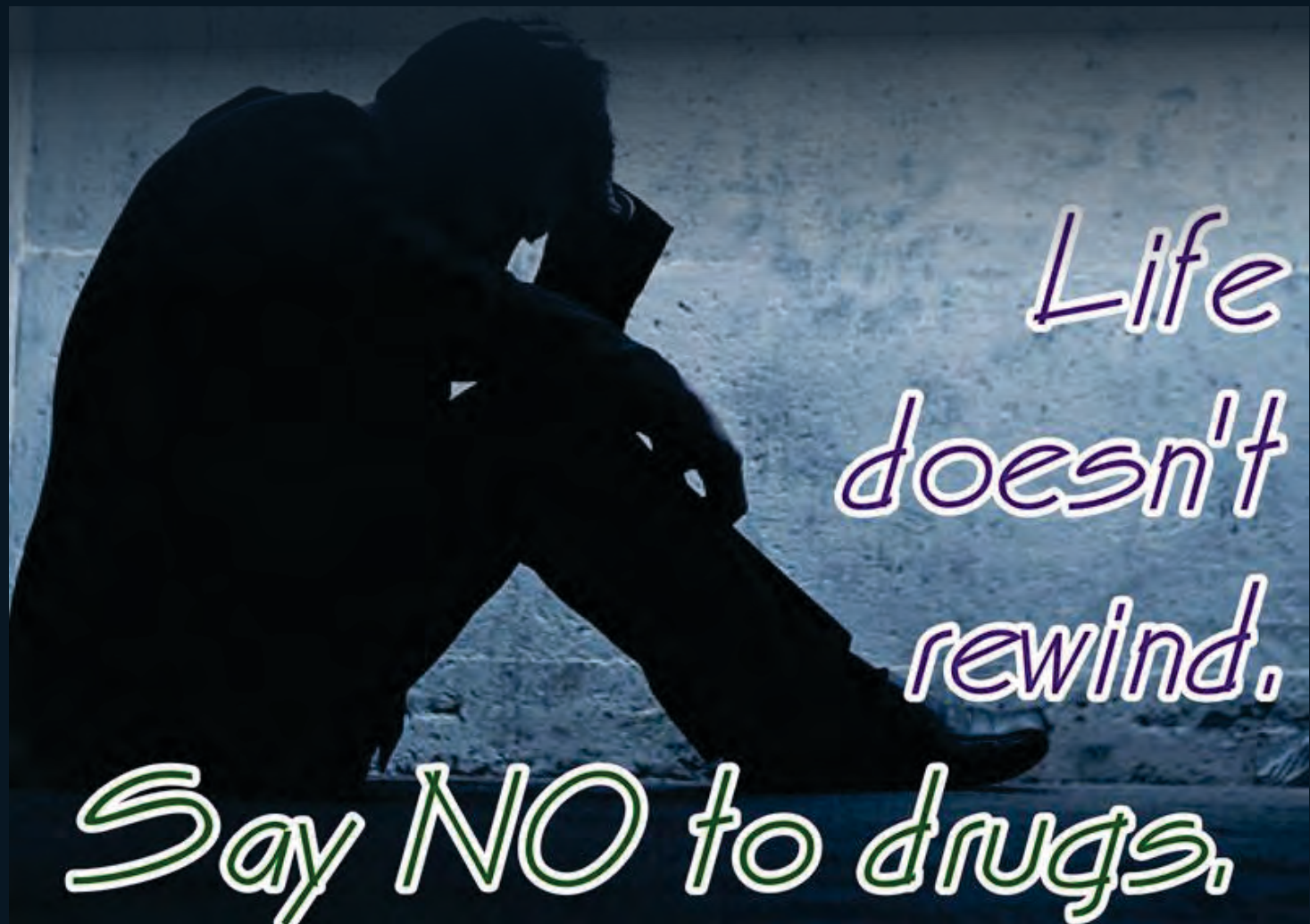
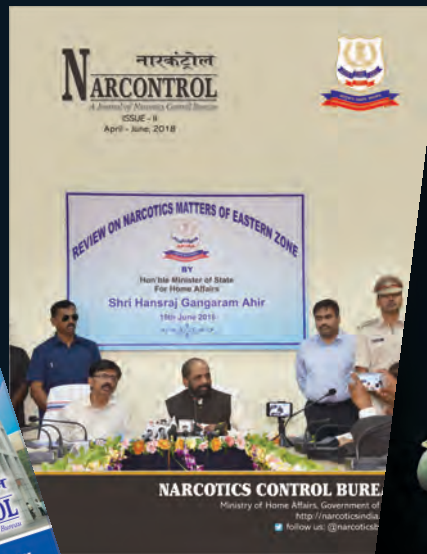

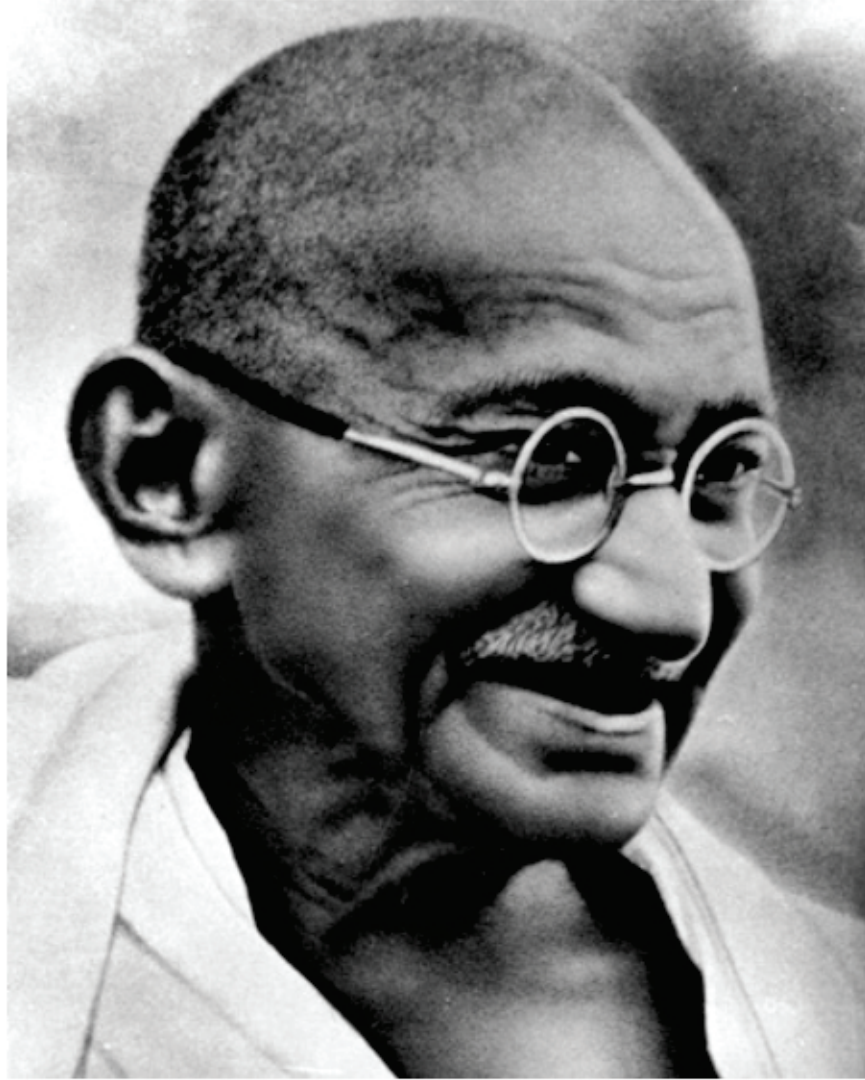
